

Overall, do you think things in _____ are headed in the right direction, or do you feel that they are off on the wrong track?










State Center CCD Need for Local Funding

Mock Local Funding Measure Ballot Question


LOCAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE CAMPUS SAFETY, CLASSROOM REPAIR AND CAREER EDUCATION IMPROVEMENT MEASURE.

To upgrade Fresno City, Clovis, Reedley, Madera colleges/ classrooms/ education centers; increase security fencing/ door locks/ emergency communications; improve technology/ healthcare/ public safety/ agricultural career education programs; remove asbestos, lead paint; provide student/ faculty housing; acquire, construct, repair facilities, replace sites, equipment; shall State Center Community College District's measure authorizing \$700,000,000 in bonds at legal rates, levying \$25 per \$100,000 of assessed valuation, generating \$47,000,000 annually while bonds are outstanding be adopted, with oversight, all funds used locally?



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Six in ten vote in favor of the bond measure, surpassing the 55% threshold needed for passage












There is also a recognition that community colleges must be improved to meet education changes, ensure safety and meet demand for classes.





Top educational priorities are addressing health and safety issues and improving career education programs.






Repairing college infrastructure and helping students transfer to 4-year schools are also highly important.




Seven in ten voters identify helping veterans to enter the workforce.






Six in ten support using funds for safety upgrades and other improvement projects.






Voter Reaction to Additional Educational Priorities
