Interim Chancellor's Report

Dr. Crow thanked everyone for a very smooth opening of the semester. With the late passage of the budget, the campuses worked very hard to accommodate the students in their search for classes and services.

The three year strategic plan is coming together very well. The steering committee will be meeting on September 12 to review a final draft. The final draft will be critiqued by staff and community members at the charrette scheduled for Wednesday, September 24, from 5:30 to 8:30 p.m. in the FCC cafeteria. The input from the charrette will be used to fine tune the plan. The Board will receive a final draft in November, and will be asked for approval of the final plan at the December meeting.

Class III of the leadership program for classified professionals had their first meeting on August 22. The monthly meetings focus on various topics in management and leadership. Graduation is scheduled for December 12.

The Fresno Area College Night is scheduled for Wednesday, September 10, in the Fresno Convention Center. The District always has outstanding representation from Fresno City College, Reedley College, and the North Centers.
