Mr. Forhan stated that this is a very modest amount of money and questioned if there are more funds that could be accessed, as this is a very saleable program.

A motion was made by Ms. Smith and seconded by Ms. Shah that the Board of Trustees:

- a) authorize the District, on behalf of Fresno City College, to enter into an Agreement with the Foundation for California Community Colleges and Fresno Unified School District to establish the Design Sciences Early College High School with first-year funding in the amount of \$72,493.00 for the period July 1, 2004, through June 30, 2005;
- b) authorize the Chancellor or Vice Chancellor-Finance and Administration to sign the Agreement on behalf of the District; and
- c) authorize renewal of the Agreement with similar terms and conditions.
