Approval of Minutes

The minutes of the Board meeting of May 3, 2005, were presented for approval. A motion was made by Ms. Smith and seconded by Mr. Feaver to approve the minutes of the May 3, 2005, meeting as presented. The motion carried unanimously.

Delegations, Petitions, and Communications

Tami Bubbel and Irma Megarit, both with the Mountain Hope Association, expressed their appreciation for the DSPS program at the Oakhurst Center. Lori Blake, Yosemite High School special education teacher, also thanked the Board for the program and spoke to the opportunity the program provides for the students to transition from high school to learning life skills.

Mr. Forhan stated that during the campaign last October and November, he had an opportunity to meet with the Mountain Hope Association. It is a tremendous program and he hopes that the District can continue with these types of programs in the community.

Chancellor's Report

Dr. Crow stated that in keeping with the District's mission, the District strives to provide educational opportunities for students throughout our service area. Tonight we have the pleasure of meeting at the Oakhurst Center. The Center provides our students to the north access to comprehensive academic programming. Later in the meeting, we'll hear more about the many Oakhurst offerings from Dr. Richard Hoffman, coordinator of the Oakhurst Center. Dr. Crow also recognized Dr. Hoffman's leadership at the Oakhurst Center and wished him well in his retirement.

The latest news from Sacramento on the ongoing budget discussions seems to indicate that a resolution between the Governor's office and the Legislature is far down the road. According to the Community College League, the system's support for \$80 million in equalization is supported by legislators of both parties, although many legislators said that the total funding available will likely not exceed the Governor's May Revise proposal.

Chancellor's Report (continued)

The big question remaining is whether the Senate's \$2 billion higher Proposition 98 spending level--which assumes a tax increase--is followed. With the Conference Committee in session, and the need for the Governor to make a decision about the potential November special election by June 13, major developments are expected shortly on the budget.

You may have seen an article in the Fresno Bee last Monday, which featured Reedley College's forest/park technology program. In addition to the feature article, the Bee awarded a "thumbs-up" to the program this past Saturday. The program is an excellent example of one of the many vocational education programs that we have in place. Kudos to forestry instructor Kent Kinney and others that make this program a state-wide standout.

Last week he met with Pete Weber, Ken Newby and Ashley Swearengin from the Regional Jobs Initiative regarding some possible ideas on how to better serve the health care industry training needs. As mentioned in previous Board meetings, State Center is taking a very active role in the RJI. The purpose of my recent conversation with the RJI folks was to open up dialogue and brainstorm about strategies that may streamline some of our health care training programs. I've asked the campuses to brainstorm with faculty and staff as to ways we can maximize our current offerings. I will keep you informed as we progress.

A motion was made by Ms. Barreras and seconded by Ms. Smith that the Board of Trustees direct the Chancellor to notify the Fresno County Superintendent of School that there will be no objection to the State Center Community College District Personnel Commission budget of \$314,900.00 for the 2005-06 fiscal year. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Forhan stated that in the past, the Personnel Commissioners have been paid \$15.00 per meeting. There is a proposal to pay them \$50.00 per meeting to help defray expenses for gas, etc. He added that some Commissioners have served for a long time and he would hope that it would be District policy to recognize them with a resolution in appreciation of their service, and would also like for the members of the Measure E Oversight Committee to be recognized with resolutions as well.

<u>Action</u>

A motion was made by Mr. Forhan to amend the item to include an increase in the salary for the Personnel Commissioners to \$50.00 per month.

Mr. Patterson stated that he would like to wait until the next Board meeting and research what other District's pay their Commissioners.

Mr. Thonesen seconded the motion and added that he agrees with the salary increase as the Commissioners do work hard.

Mr. Smith questioned if the Board had jurisdiction on the salary increase. Mr. Rowe stated "yes".

The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Forhan continued that in the last five years the growth at Fresno City College was 11.8%, but the transfer rate has fallen 24.7% and believes this is a serious issue. He asked Dr. Crow if the information is correct.

Dr. Crow asked that the Board share their concerns with the campus presidents as soon as possible due to the tight timeline before the documents must be sent to the accreditation team.

Mr. Patterson stated that the staff, faculty, and administration have put a lot of time into this project and while he believes it is important for the Board to make some notations, it is the staff's work. If the item is tabled, it will create a hardship. In addition, the presidents have not been given the opportunity to make their presentation.

Ms. Smith and Ms. Barreras stated that in the future they would appreciate more time to review the documents.

Mr. Thonesen stated that the self study is for the campuses.

Mr. Forhan said that he is not sure that anyone other than staff has seen the documents. The Board is responsible and the transfer information is a flag. If the other Board members have read the studies and are comfortable, then he is fine with it.

Dr. Doffoney provided a brief overview of the draft self study report.

Mr. Forhan stated that he would like to ask the same question that he asked the Chancellor, "is the information correct?"

Dr. Doffoney confirmed that the information is correct to the best of his knowledge.

Mr. Forhan stated that he appreciated the candor and information that Dr. Doffoney presented. His concern is, as an elected official, not having the correct information.

Mr. Patterson remarked that the staff has done a good job and the Board should not be nitpicking or belittling the report.
Mr. Forhan has been bringing up the transfer issue for a long time. The intent of accreditation is to look at things and find out how to change them, if necessary.

Consideration to Approve the Draft Institutional Self-Study Reports, Fresno City College and Reedley College [05-138] (continued) Ms. Smith added that she does not have any qualms with the self study; she just did not have time to review it. The study did what it is supposed to do.

Mr. Forhan commented that this is CPEC data, it is difficult to understand, and the information may be in explained in the document.

Dr. Hioco then provided a brief explanation of the Reedley College self study process and the differences in the standards from previous years.
