Chancellor's Report

Dr. Crow reported the following:

Vocational Education Meetings and Bus Tour – Last week, Dr. Azari, Dr. Patterson and Dr. Crow met with the campuses to review progress on some of the suggestions made during the SCCCD Career and Technical Education Summit in Fall 2006. The meetings were very enlightening, and he is pleased to report that since the summit, a number of changes have been made in order to make the District's career and technical education programs more relevant and "employer and student friendly." Later in the meeting Dr. Azari would be presenting a status report on the career and technical education offerings. The Workforce Investment Board and Fresno County Economic Development Commission also received this report. Dr. Crow extended an invitation for the Board to participate in the SCCCD career and technical education bus tour scheduled for March 27. The responses for this year's tour have been extremely positive. Participants will be touring various programs throughout the District. Due to popular demand, the allied health programs at Fresno City College will be included in the tour this year. There will be a comprehensive review of the occupational programs at the Board Retreat.

<u>Disaster Training</u> – Last month Dr. Crow reported to the Board that the District's management and administrative leaders attended a mandatory two-hour disaster training workshop. This Thursday, campus CEO's, PIO's and other key personnel will participate in a six-hour mandatory training designed to provide more in-depth training on disaster preparedness. Campus safety

is a top priority for many campuses around the United States, and SCCCD is no exception.

<u>Classified Professionals Mega Conference</u> – Dr. Crow extended a personal invitation to the Board to attend the conference on March 18. Every year the conference gets bigger and better, and Dr. Crow thanked the classified professionals for their hard work to make this event such a success.

<u>Trustee Thonesen's Prize</u> – Dr. Crow congratulated Mr. Thonesen for winning a new Kawasaki 250 Quad at the 2008 Ag Expo in Tulare, and commented that Les was thrilled to win the Quad since the model he was using is over 20 years old.

Campus Reports

Dr. Doffoney reported the following from Fresno City College:

- Congratulations were extended to the FCC men's and women's basketball teams; both are seeded #2 in the NorCal rankings, and both won their first round games in the playoffs. Player Lena Gipson is this year's Northern California Player of the Year, and she was also named state Co-MVP by the California Community College Coaches Association.
- The Governor's Office and Fresno Mayor Autry will be at the Manchester Education Resource Center during a series of workshops on the Reconnect Fresno event on March 5. The Governor will have a press conference at 3 p.m. to talk about One Stop and the services available in the Fresno area.
- The fourth annual Renaissance Feast for Scholars is Saturday, March 8 at the Fresno City College Library.
- The 2008 Spring Job Fair will be held March 12.
- Ms. Natalie Culver-Dockins was introduced by President Doffoney. She is the new Dean of Instruction of Workforce Development.

- Reedley College and the Cooperative Association of States for Scholarship (CASS) were visited by dignitaries from El Salvador, Guatemala, and Honduras and were hosted by Manual Cunha, Jr., president of the Nisei Farmers League.
- Art instructor Garrett Masterson's work "Human Torso" was exhibited at the Fig Tree Gallery in Fresno during ArtHop.
- Counseling Chair Mario Gonzales and Assessment Center Coordinator Steve Jones, along with counselors from Fresno City College and Willow International Center, will be presenting "SCCCD Online Counseling: FAQ, Live Help, and Online Orientation," on March 2 at the Innovation Conference in Denver.

- The Pre-Professional Health Club is holding its second annual Health Career Conference on March 29 at Reedley College.
- Congratulations were extended to the RC men's basketball team, ranked #11, who earned a spot in the playoffs against San Joaquin Delta College, #6, on February 29, and advanced to the second round of playoffs against #3 Yuba College.

Academic Senate Report

- Maintaining focus on items that are within the purview of the Academic Senate to address so that the Academic Senate can develop goals and objectives that are going to help further the strategic planning goals of the FCC and SCCCD.
- The Basic Skills Committee, subcommittee of the Senate, has held a workshop on assessment that was well attended by over 40 instructors. Discussion centered on keeping students on track day-to-day.
- A conference is planned for the end of April.
- Reading and writing across the curriculum is on Thursday; the Board members are invited to attend.

Classified Senate Report

Ms. Renee Dauer, Reedley College Classified Senate President, reported the following:

- Discussions are taking place regarding the recommendations from the Committee on Committees.
- Holding a See's Candy Easter fundraiser for the four scholarships given in the fall semester each year and renewable in the spring.
- Partnering with Reedley College's student services team for the Relay for Life held April 26 and 27.
- Classified Professionals are putting the finishing touches on the annual Mega Conference scheduled for March 18. The Pride of SCCCD is going to be a great event with outstanding presenters and speakers. The classified professional of the year will be announced at lunch. The keynote speaker will be Fresno High School coach and teacher Ray Reyes. The Board members were extended invitations to attend.
- Nominations are being accepted for the Leadership State Center Class VIII.
- This month's technology training on PowerPoint advanced functions is scheduled for March 27.

Workforce Development

Presenting the update on the SCCCD workforce development efforts were Vice Chancellor of Workforce Development and Educational Services Cynthia Azari, Dean of Applied Technology Rick Christl, Director of the Training Institute Charles Francis, RC Vice President of Instruction Kim Perry, and NC Dean of Instruction Jim Chin. Included in the update were the findings from the Fresno County Workforce Investment Board's industry survey in the areas of healthcare, construction/trades, manufacturing, logistics/distribution, automotive technology and information services. The data presented included overall employment numbers and the highest growth occupations. SCCCD faculty and staff have responded to employers' workforce demands by developing partnerships with industries and continually upgrading classes, building capacity, changing programs, and adding new programs. This is an exciting time as the colleges and centers are contributing in pivotal ways toward delivering a trained workforce to Fresno area employers.

Chancellor Crow commended the campuses and departments for their hard work and the aggressive nature they have taken in scouting out, writing and successfully securing a large number of grants. They are working very closely with the Workforce Investment Board by partnering with them, as well as working with the State Chancellor's Office, and the Governor's Office in securing funding. He said that this is a real turnaround for SCCCD and that the Summit and advisory committees have been instrumental in communicating to us what it takes to get people employed. The presentation is a snapshot of how well faculty and staff have responded.

The presentation was followed with questions from the Board members and discussion.

He pointed out that Measure E bond proceeds were expended only for the purposes set forth in the bond measure; and no bond proceeds were used for any teacher or administrative salaries or other operational expenses.

Reports of Board Members

Jennifer Fielden, RC Student Trustee, reported the following:

- February 20, RC students heard a motivational presentation for Black History Month by Rick Jennings, 1977 Super Bowl champion and Oakland Raider, who was a speaker. He is a Sacramento City Unified School District board member and chief executive officer for the Center for Fathers and Families.
- March 7 ASB is having a pamper yourself day featuring vendors and activities.
- March 11 ASB will be selling newspapers for the Kids' Day annual Fresno Bee fundraiser for Children's Hospital Central California.
- March 27 ASB will be playing the Bowlathon at Fresno State for Big Brothers, Big Sisters.
- April 3 is the Reedley College open house, Kaleidoscope, and ASB and campus student clubs are planning for this event.

Larissa Childers, FCC Student Trustee, reported the following:

- As part of ASG's pledge to keep FCC clean, they are hosting a three-day event, March 24-27, with organic shirts, recyclable pens, information booths, promotional materials by Don't Trash California, campus clean up, and a lecture and musical presentation by environmental activist Jonny Dubowsky.

Ms. Smith attended the full board meeting of the State Center Community College Foundation where she had an opportunity to hear from many of the worthy students who received awards through the Foundation. They have had to overcome obstacles and are accomplishing their educational goals.

Ms. Smith reported that DeWolf High School will hold their annual Career Fair on March 14. SCCCD will be represented. She extended an invitation to attend.

Mr. Patterson reported on his attendance at the ACCT conference in Washington DC and his visits to the Capitol. He reported visiting with staff from legislators' offices, such as that of Devin Nunes. He found the staff to be very knowledgeable and supportive of legislation that ACCT was advocating. He noted that Congressman Devin Nunes' area of representation is within SCCCD and encourages more contact with him.

Mr. Feaver announced that Chancellor Tom Crow will be presented the prestigious Harold Haak Educational Leadership Award at the Fresno Compact's annual Business Partnership Luncheon on March 5. He and the Board congratulated Dr. Crow as most deserving of this high honor, which recognizes outstanding leadership in education.

President Feaver asked for two Board members to serve on the interview panel for the General Counsel position. The interviews will be held in March 2008. Trustees Isabel Barreras and Willie Smith agreed to serve.
