Swearing In/Affirming of New Student Trustee

Dr. Crow administered the Oath of Allegiance to Ms. Natalie Nelson, Fresno City College Student Trustee.

Chancellor's Report

Dr. Crow reported the following:

Extreme Registration – Congratulations to the campuses and centers for the enormous success of the "Extreme Registration" enrollment event. Over 2000 potential students visited the sites to participate in "one-stop" registration for the fall semester. Financial aid reps, counselors and admissions personnel were all on hand in one convenient location to provide services to students in a festive atmosphere. Due to the overwhelming response, the campuses and centers are hosting another round of Extreme Registration next week.

ACCT Study – ACCT is conducting a national study on the backgrounds, experiences and contributions of community college trustees. State Center has been selected to participate in the study. This comprehensive study will provide critical data that will be used to develop leadership programs for community college trustees throughout the United States. The study is voluntary and completely confidential. Only aggregate data will be reported. The Board received the survey at the meeting and were asked to complete and return it in the envelope provided.

### Chancellor's Report (continued)

Economic and Workforce Development Forum – Friday, November 14 is the District's annual Economic and Workforce Development Forum. This year's breakfast will feature State Senator Jack Scott, former Pasadena City College President and soon-to-be California Community Colleges' Chancellor; and Dan Walters, syndicated political columnist. Forum attendees will hear updates from Sacramento, as well as progress on SCCCD's post-Summit workforce development effort. More information will be provided in the near future.

#### Campus Reports

Dr. Kershaw reported on the following from the North Centers.

- Reedley College and the North Centers were awarded a oneyear \$175,000 grant by the Board of Governors in support of preparing high school seniors for the CAHSEE.
- The North Centers held Extreme Registration in July. The next event is August 11 through August 13.
- The North Centers fall Duty Day is August 14 at Willow International Center and includes workshops on moving WI to college status, and updates on student learning outcomes.
- Annual adjunct faculty orientation is August 14.
- Parking lots are being installed at the Willow International Center, and initial grading and infrastructure work for the 80,000 square foot Academic Center Phase Two facility.
- The Oakhurst Center computer lab is being completed prior to the beginning of the fall semester.
- The Foundation for California Community Colleges selected Fresno City College, including Madera Center, as one of eight California community colleges to receive \$80,000 to help foster youth become more independent. Madera Center will serve 25 foster youth through campus-based workshops in education, daily living skills, and financial literacy.

Dr. Lease reported on the following topics from Fresno City College.

- The registered nursing program has been awarded a two-year Enrollment Growth and Retention Program grant totaling almost \$1 million.
- FCC enrollment is increased by over six percent in unduplicated headcount with a thirty percent increase in students taken 15 or more units.
- Over 1600 students have attended Extreme Registration in July. The next Extreme Registration is August 11-13, and 16
- Shuttle service will be run between the Ratcliffe Stadium and the main campus the first three weeks of the semester.
- The FCC Faculty and Staff Fall 2008 Convocation is August 14. Flex day activities are scheduled for August 15.

Dr. Hioco reported on the following topics from Reedley College:

- New student orientation sessions are being held August 13.
- The Adjunct Academy Workshop is August 7.
- The next Extreme Registration sessions are August 11-13, 16.
- Darius Reynolds, Reedley College football player, was named the #1 junior college quarterback in the nation by *Sporting News* this month. JC Football.com and Rivals.com ranked him #2 in the country in all positions.
- School Relations Specialist Mia Navarro was a guest on Arriba Valle Central aired on Channel 21, July 18.
- Forestry instructor Jason Pinkerton and student Teresa Lowe were on KSEE 24, July 28, promoting the forestry program.
- RC is sponsoring a student ambassador to participate in HACU's annual conference in Denver in October.
- The 17<sup>th</sup> Annual Induction Banquet for the Tiger Athletic Hall of Fame was August 2. Keith Hughes, men's basketball coach 1987-98, is one of the eight inductees.

# Academic Senate Report

- The landscape of Reedley College continues to change with the beginning of construction of the new residence hall, modernization of the student union, art and physical science buildings, and the City of Reedley Rails-to-Trails project.
- The RC Academic Senate made faculty appointments for 17 standing committees, and met with FCC Academic Senate representatives regarding proposed revisions to the District's Board Policies and Administrative Regulations.
- Representatives attended the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges' Curriculum Institute in Redwood City.
- Academic Senate extends a collegial welcome to 16 new faculty members at Reedley College and the North Centers.
- The Executive Committee met at the end of the academic year at which Dr. Hioco gave a presentation on developing a Reedley College comprehensive educational master plan.
- Mr. Nishinaka expressed the Academic Senate's appreciation of service of Immediate Past-President Bill Turini.
- The Academic Senate will discuss several key items starting this fall, including mid-term accreditation report, certification for local approval of credit courses, districtwide standardized subject placement test.

- Mr. Nishinaka attended the Irrigation Association Education Foundation Faculty Academy in Denver.

### Classified Senate Report

Mr. Ernie Garcia, Fresno City College Classified Senate President, reported the following:

- Mr. Garcia is honored to be the President of the Classified Senate. He noted that he is a former FCC student trustee.
- The Classified Senate Executive Board members are Vice President Jewell Riversmith, Treasurer Elizabeth Davidian and Secretary Jennifer Franklin.
- The Classified Senate held their first meeting July 16.
- The Classified Senate agreed to purchase a table for their constituents at Central California Women's Conference.
- Goals are being set for this academic year, including raising awareness and visibility of the Classified Senate on campus and finding representation for vacant senate seats.
- Planning the annual Classified Senate staff development day scheduled for Tuesday, November 11. The theme will be "Classified Superheroes – Here to Save the Day."
- The next meeting is August 13.
- Mr. Garcia expressed appreciation for the continued support of the Classified Senate.

# Process for Center to College Status

Dr. Terry Kershaw, Vice Chancellor–North Centers, thanked the Board of Trustees, and past and current chancellors, Dr. Bill Stewart and Dr. Tom Crow, for establishing the vision for the North Centers, comprised of the Madera Center, Oakhurst Center, Clovis Center and the Willow International Center. Because of their vision, their implementation and efforts, Willow International Center is now starting the process to become the third college in the State Center Community College District. Fresno City College is now planning their 100<sup>th</sup> year anniversary and Reedley College joined SCCCD 80 years ago.

Dr. Kershaw, gave a report and provided a slide presentation on the plan for conversion of the Willow International Center to a fully accredited college, the third in the State Center Community College District. The Center is embarking on the stages leading to accreditation starting Fall 2008 with an anticipated initial accreditation in Fall 2012. Included in the stages are steps for approval by agencies of CPEC, BOG, COCCC, ACCJC and WASC (California Postsecondary Education Commission, Board of Governors, Chancellor's Office—California Community

Process for Center to College Status (continued) Colleges, Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges, Western Association of Schools and Colleges), and final acceptance of the WASC recommendation by COCCC.

Ms. Smith thanked Dr. Kershaw for his report stating that she appreciates the hard work and dedication the team is putting into the effort for the Willow International Center to become a fully accredited college. Based on what she has seen, read and heard, she believes that Willow International Center would receive approval. Ms. Smith said she is glad that Dr. Bill Stewart was mentioned because the people who were not in the district when he was chancellor should know that it was his vision that began moving the district toward this point.
