A 12-unit certificate program that aims to provide students with the skills-based learning necessary to succeed in the agriculture industry



1 in 3 workers are at risk for automation. These field workers have been at the forefront of feeding the nation and will be prioritized for this program.



After completion, students can pursue entry-level jobs in agriculture, or continue their education by specializing at a community college



Will be the same across 8 community colleges in the region

- Students can select, effectively utilize, and identify faults with technologies for agricultural processes
- Students can exhibit employability skills, quantitative reasoning, and effective communication




How Important do you view education?









Educational Questions Level of Education


















Would you be interested if there was childcare offered?



Key Takeaways



Clear demand for upskilling and re-skilling.



Despite interest, cost remains a primary concern with **86**% respondents indicating financial insecurity in the last year.



Online learning is
becoming increasingly
popular with **70%**indicating their interest
would increase if at home
learning was offered.



Farmworkers continue to have to choose between working or going to school.

With 46% percent citing their reason for leaving school as needing to work.



As we've seen from the farmworker surveys, there are still many challenges facing our agricultural workforce. However, through the AgTEC program, we're working to address these challenges and provide training and support to workers across the region.
