Mr. Sharpe introduced Mr. Scott O'Dell of Paoli and Associates who shared the results of the final Environmental Impact Report (EIR) as well as the EIR process, including the various potential impacts, mitigation reporting procedures, notification of persons, organizations and public agencies, and receipt of comments.

Mr. Manfredi referred to pages 1-10 and 1-11 and expressed concern regarding the District's obligation if state funding is not available for the needed improvements. Mr. O'Dell explained that the District is obligated to pay whatever possible toward impacts that the project causes; however, the District's first responsibility as a public agency is to educate students. No funds would be taken away from the education of students; the only funding that would be applied to the pro-rated share of improvements would come from the state and there would be no obligation from the District's General Fund. It is a good faith effort to find the funds if available. Mr. Manfredi stated that that

Public Hearing and Consideration of Resolution for Certification of Environmental Impact Report for Willow/International Community College Center Project [02-36] (continued) he objected to the words "shall" on pages 1-10 and 1-11 and suggested they be changed to "good faith effort" or "may."

Mr. Sharpe noted that the staff shared the same concerns with the consultants and were assured that it is the District's obligation to attempt to mitigate to the best of their ability to help with the prorata share. After checking with the experts, it is believed that the language is appropriate and the District is protected.

Mr. Thonesen questioned the fifteen acres covered by the Williamson Act and if the District would be responsible for the difference in taxes. Mr. Jeff Kuhn, Legal Counsel, explained there would be no penalty because it is being acquired by a public agency; neither the property owner nor the District will be obligated to pay the difference in the property taxes.

Mr. Sharpe introduced Mr. Bob Madewell from the City of Fresno. Mr. Madewell assured the Board that the District's fees for transportation improvements will be covered under the UGM benefits. Mr. Madewell also explained how Nexus fees are determined.

Public Hearing

Mr. Forhan opened the public hearing at 5:10 p.m. There being no comments from the public the hearing was closed at 5:11 p.m.

A motion was made by Mr. Manfredi and seconded by Mr. Smith that the Board of Trustees certify the Final Environmental Impact Report (Final EIR) pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act, approve the project, and adopt Resolution No. 02-36, Findings and Statement of Overriding Considerations Pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines, Sections 15091 and 15093.

A motion was made by Mr. Thonesen and seconded by Mr. Corona that the Board of Trustees award Bid #0102-14 in the amount of \$106,769.00 to Valley Unique Electric, Inc., the lowest responsible bidder for Electrical Upgrades, Phase I, at Reedley College, and authorize the Chancellor or Executive Vice Chancellor to sign an agreement on behalf of the District. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Sharpe gave a brief update on the agreement with The Burlington Northern and Santa Fe Railway Company and provided photos of the proposed fence and improvements from McKinley Avenue to just north of the Allied Health Building, as well as the proposed vehicle/pedestrian underpass at Weldon Avenue.

Board members discussed liability issues regarding injuries from the fence, the possible creation of a prison atmosphere, alternative landscaping rather than a fence, and approval by the railroad for the District to provide and maintain landscaping in the easement along the fence.

A motion was made by Mr. Patterson and seconded by Ms. Todd that the Board of Trustees authorize an agreement with The Burlington Northern and Santa Fe Railway Company for the construction and maintenance of a wrought iron fence along the east side of the railroad tracks crossing the Fresno City College campus, with all design and construction costs to be absorbed by BNSF, and future maintenance costs to be paid by State Center Community College District; and authorize the Chancellor or Executive Vice Chancellor to sign the agreement on behalf of the District. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Forhan suggested using lottery monies to properly landscape the area.

Board members expressed appreciation to the railroad for their concern regarding student safety.

Mr. Tom Bailey, Fresno Area Residents for Rail Consolidation, thanked the Board and District for their support and for approving the agreement with the railroad today. Consolidation of the tracks is a long way off, but it is doable and is well on its way.

Consideration to Adopt 2002-03 Budget Development Calendar [02-40] Action

A motion was made by Mr. Smith and seconded by Mr. Patterson that the Board of Trustees approve the 2002-03 Budget Development Calendar as presented. The motion carried unanimously.

Reports of Board Members Mr. Warren Bisel, Reedley College Student Trustee, reported on Black History Month activities to include: the movie series, "Roots," and "The Color Purple," Soul Food Day on February 19, Gospel Singers on February 22, and a Poetry Contest. In honor of the winter games, Olympian Lacy Barnes-Mileham has provided many of her own awards and mementos to decorate a display window.

Ms. Margaret Todd, Fresno City College Student Trustee, also reported on Black History Month activities, the upcoming CalSACC Leadership Conference, "Stop the Hate" Campaign, and the Renaissance Fair on March 9-10.

Mr. Patterson stated that he attended the CCLC Conference in Sacramento over the weekend and it is doom and gloom for next year's budget.

Mr. Manfredi stated that he also attended the CCLC Conference and acquired some information on marketing and bond campaigns. Last Friday, the Districtwide Marketing Committee met and discussed having a stronger district image while retaining the positive image of the college identities, the importance of not duplicating services and better coordination. He added that he appreciated the update on Black History Month activities at the Madera Center but reiterated that activities also need to be planned for the evenings and weekends in order to engage the community.

Mr. Corona congratulated Dr. Edwards on her efforts with the Foundation. He recently attended a Foundation luncheon meeting and there are a lot of good things happening.

Mr. Forhan reported that he attended the International Education Reception on January 25 and encouraged the District to make international education a high priority, see that it is properly monitored, and that it continues to grow.

Old Business

Ms. Smith requested that the Board receive information on Women's History Month in March, and Community College Month in April.

Mr. Smith stated that he received a telephone call from someone indicating that a Personnel Commission meeting had been held on the birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr. The Board has adopted this as an official holiday and he was disappointed to find out that the Commission was conducting business on this day. Mr. Rowe stated that Mr. Josserand had scheduled the date on the calendar that was approved by the Commission in December. Mr. Forhan also expressed his dismay at the Commission meeting on this day.

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Old Business (continued)

Mr. Rowe stated that the information was voiced to the Commission and Mr. Josserand at the meeting.

Mr. Thonesen acknowledged Mr. Forhan for his participation in introducing Senator Bill Jones and moderating a panel discussion at the CCLC Conference.
