Ms. Smith expressed concern about the information campaign focusing on the District rather than each institution, and the possible loss of each site's identity. She further stated that if the consultant is going to tell us that we are the State Center Community College District, she cannot agree with it. If the consultant says we are a District and each individual institution should be identified as such, she can vote for it.

Board members stressed the need for a balanced campaign to ensure that all needs are met and that the community not only realizes who State Center Community College District is, but is aware of the needs; i.e., facilities, etc.

Ms. Smith stated that she enjoyed speaking to the Caucus and it was good to see so many students involved. She attended the Wall of Honor and it was very well attended. She read the article in the *Rampage* regarding Disabled Students and appreciates how much is being done for the students in this program. Regarding the nursing shortage, she is glad the District is looking at other alternatives for additional programs.

Mr. Patterson reported that he had the joy of working with staff on the Fresno City College President Search process. It was good to see the interaction, professionalism, and everyone having a say in the process.

Mr. Manfredi complimented staff for the Wall of Honor event. The Marketing Committee had their second meeting last Friday and Dr. Patterson led a mini workshop that highlighted campus programs' points of pride. The Historic Old Administration Building Committee has not met with the faculty coalition recently, but the coalition is meeting and is looking at some potential fundraising events.

Mr. Corona commented that he continues to be impressed by the quality of leadership at State Center and feels that the organization is full of excellent staff at all levels.

Mr. Forhan stated that the afternoons of March 20-21 have been proposed for the Board to interview the finalists for the Fresno City College President. Following a brief discussion regarding the Board members' schedules, it was agreed the interviews would take place on the afternoons of March 20-21.

Ms. Smith advised that the Governor has proposed that vocational education be taken out of the high schools and placed in the community colleges. She questioned where the District stands on this proposal. Dr. Redwine stated that this issue caught all the community colleges by surprise and was not initiated by the community colleges. She has also advised staff in Sacramento that if there was a committee being put together on this issue, that State Center would like to be involved.
