Mr. Forhan stated that Items 03-11 and 03-12 total \$2.5 million and should have been placed on the regular agenda, and should not be approved until Item 03-22 is approved. He questioned if Darden and Associates was the sole source for these services. Mr. Brinkley explained that Darden and Associates had done the IPP's and FPP's for the project, so the District would continue with the same architect. Mr. Forhan referred to Darden's design and placement of the building at the Madera Center, and the problems with the afternoon sun. He further stated that some time ago it was the desire of the Board to go out with RFQ's, and to ensure that minority architects/contractors were included in the process. Mr. Patterson noted that the Board should accept some of the responsibility for the Madera building as they approved the plans and the building.

Mr. Forhan questioned \$482,000.00 for oversight of the project. Mr. Speece explained this expense is for oversight by architects, engineers, etc. for the entire project. It is formula based as per capital project guidelines and the State Chancellor's office. He also reminded the Board that Mr. Sharpe had previously asked for Board approval of \$2.4 million in local funds for this project in order to keep it going at the state and to keep it competitive.

Now, the District will use the bond money, but at the time, it was approved as local money. Mr. Forhan requested that in the future, reference to previous actions be made in the report.

Mr. Smith asked that given the criticism and dissatisfaction expressed so far, where does this leave the project if the Board does not approve it tonight. Mr. Brinkley stated that the project would be delayed for another one to two years.

A motion was made by Mr. Forhan and seconded by Mr. Smith that action on Items 03-11 and 03-12 be tabled until after Item 03-22 has been heard. The motion carried unanimously.

Consideration to Approve Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee Bylaws [03-23] Mr. Brinkley explained that the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee is formed for financial oversight reasons only and determines if the District is spending the funds appropriately as defined in the bond measure. The Bylaws have been modified in order to personalize them to our district.

Ms. Smith questioned if the committee would receive the appropriate training as well as a list of duties.

Mr. Smith asked about participation by the constituent groups. Mr. Brinkley explained that the District is prohibited from having employees serve on the committee; however, they can nominate individuals, etc.

Mr. Corona noted that the bylaws should be amended to show that the Committee is not part of the site selection process. He added that there is a lot of confusion regarding the bond process and suggested that a Board workshop be scheduled.

Ms. Barreras questioned if the unions were invited to participate in the bond campaign, and if not, it is important that they be included in the future.

Mr. Forhan asked if there would be a special committee for the Historic Old Administration Building. Mr. Brinkley responded yes and they were scheduled to meet this week.

Mr. Francis Sullivan stated that when Proposition 39 passed, it was a way for the taxpayer to know how funds will be spent. He sees some things in the bylaws that go against Proposition 39 and asked about the checks and balances of the committee.

Mr. Patterson stated that Proposition 39 was designed to take care of a district that was going out for additional bonds and had spent the funds in ways other than those stated on the ballot.

Mr. Smith stated that regarding Ms. Barreras' earlier question regarding the unions' involvement in the bond campaign, he has some concerns as he has received conflicting information.

Ms. Barreras asked what changes had been made to the bylaws. Mr. Brinkley noted that Sections 3.4 and 3.5 were added to indicate the Board and Chancellor's part in the process.

Mr. Sullivan noted that Section 5, Membership, speaks to the minimum number of seven committee members and that the District can add more as it sees fit.
