Motion to Add an Item to Closed Session Ms. Smith requested that an item be added to the Closed Session agenda: THREAT TO SECURITY OF PUBLIC SERVICES OR FACILITIES, Pursuant to Government Code Section 54957, Consultation with Police Chief Marvin Reyes. A motion was made by Mr. Thonesen and seconded by Ms. Barreras that the item be added to the Closed Session agenda. The motion carried unanimously.

Delegations, Petitions, and Communications Mr. James Carroll, FCC student, asked for a mandatory Districtwide policy regarding textbooks being on call in the libraries. He also expressed the need for additional parking spaces for handicapped students.

Mr. Kutnerian concurred with the placement of textbooks in the libraries and noted that it is especially helpful when financial aid is not received on time and students cannot afford to buy the required textbooks.

Mr. Forhan advised that this matter should be handled by the Academic Senate rather than Board policy.

Moment of Silence

Ms. Smith asked for a moment of silence in remembrance of Samuel Fidler, a steelworker for Mid-State Steelworks, who lost his life at the Madera Center construction site on Friday, January 31, and for the seven Columbia astronauts.

Recognition of Reedley College Football Team Ms. Smith stated that the 2002 football season was Michael White's thirteenth season as head coach of the Reedley College Tigers. An unlucky number for some, this thirteenth season has been a special one for Coach White and his Tigers. He was named the 2002 National Coach of the Year by the American Community College Football Coaches Association. He was honored at the AFCA Convention in New Orleans on January 7. Michael was selected from a field of 37 coaches from around the country. The Tigers won the Central Valley Conference title, the Northern California Championship, the State Championship, and were named National Champions.

Coach White provided a short video from the American Community College Football Coaches Association banquet. Team member Nathen Saari noted the opportunities that community colleges provide for students to fulfill their dreams.

Black History Month

Ms. Smith noted that February is Black History Month and that the presidents will provide information regarding campus activities in their reports this evening.

Chancellor's Report

Dr. Redwine congratulated Ms. Lucille Rash, instructor at Fresno City College, on receiving the Martin Luther King Justice Award at Fresno City Hall on January 17. Concern over the budget continues and the District recognizes that because of the fee increase many students will be prevented from continuing their education. The presidents have been meeting with their employee community to discuss the budget cuts and the trustees will have an opportunity to review the budget cut information at the March retreat. The 2003-04 budget will be a problem also as it is expected there will be a ten to fourteen percent cut during this time period. It is projected that the budget will be a major concern over the next three to five years. It is a difficult time for all as we try to protect the interest of our students and full-time employees.

Public Hearing on Initial Full-Time Bargaining Proposals Presented by State Center Federation Local 1533, CFT/AFT, CIO/AFL [03-39] Mr. Rowe stated that the Government Code Section 3547 sets forth the "sunshine" provisions of the Rodda Act. The Board is required to hold a public hearing on the initial proposal of the employee group. The State Center Federation of Teachers, on behalf of the Full-Time Faculty, presented its initial proposals for a successor contract to the Board on January 7, 2003. The AFT Full-Time Faculty proposals are as follows:

- 1. Length of contract: three year agreement, 2003-2006
- 2. Salary: A salary formula applied annually, based on the District's ability to pay, including in-coming and on-going revenues, which will maintain/improve the faculty's state salary schedule standing.
- 3. Benefits: Fully paid health, dental, and vision benefits, including one or more additional plan options for health insurance.
- 4. Retiree Benefits: Improved retiree benefits, including 100% District paid until age 65 and increase in lifetime annual contribution.
- 5. Calendar: 16-week compressed semester schedule with winter intercession option.

- 6. Lab factor: Improvement in lab factor to .9.
- 7. On-campus requirement: Eliminate daily on-campus requirement.
- 8. Load banking: Faculty may bank overload hours for future leave time rather than receiving pay for them.
- 9. Stipends: New coaching positions not included in current contract shall include stipends commensurate with coaching positions in contract.
- 10. Distance education: Clarifying language on office hour and on-campus requirements for faculty teaching on-line courses.
- 11. Load reduction: Clarifying language on length of work year for extended contract faculty on 50% load reduction.
- 12. Class assignments: Language specifying manner in which classes are assigned per semester to faculty.
- 13. Flex days: Flex days shall be "flexible" in that faculty may select the day(s) and activities for their participation.
- 14. Senate released time: Each academic senate shall receive 2 LHE's per year released time to conduct senate business.
- 15. Evaluation of contract faculty: Language specifying if and when an evaluation committee member may be removed from a committee, and the replacement process.
- 16. Other proposals: The Federation reserves the right to add proposals on issues that may come up between January and the commencement of negotiations.

The Board agreed that the Conflict of Interest item should be handled at a separate workshop. Mr. Corona suggested that the Brown Act be discussed at the same time.

Ms. Barreras requested that the AFT and CSEA provide their agenda suggestions to the Chancellor.

Mr. Forhan suggested that the Retreat time be extended to 3:00 p.m. on Saturday.

Acknowledgement of Quarterly Financial Status Report – General Fund [03-41] Action

A motion was made by Mr. Thonesen and seconded by Mr. Corona that the Board of Trustees acknowledge the Quarterly Financial Status Report (CCFS-311Q) as presented. The motion carried unanimously.

Consideration to Amend Energy Services Agreement with CMS Viron Energy Services [03-42] Action A motion was made by Mr. Forhan and seconded by Mr. Patterson that the Board of Trustees amend the previous award of an Energy Services Agreement for Energy Retrofits, Phase II, to CMS Viron Corporation, to allow for a portion of the contract to be completed with currently available funding in an amount not to exceed \$944,000.00, and authorize the Chancellor or Vice Chancellor-Finance and Administration to sign an amended agreement on behalf of the District. The motion carried unanimously.

I. Executive Summary


Introduction

This is the Compliance Review of the County of Fresno's Treasurer's Investment Pool Portfolio for the period ended December 31, 2002, pursuant to California Government Code 53646. The report has two primary objectives: (1) to provide information regarding portfolio holdings as to compliance with California Government Code Sections 53601 and 53635, as well as the County Treasurer's Statement of Investment Policy and (2) to detail portfolio characteristics of the portfolio's investment holdings.

Quarterly Overview of Markets:

During the quarter, the US Treasury yield curve steepened slightly, which primarily benefited holders of short-term bonds. At the November 6th, 2002 meeting, the Federal Reserve lowered the federal funds rate by 50 basis points to 1.25% and reiterated their optimistic tone toward future economic growth despite geopolitical uncertainties. No changes were made to short-term rates at the Federal Reserve's December 10, 2002 meeting.

As indicated on the previous page, during the fourth quarter of 2002 short term yields decreased while long term rates slightly increased. The yield on one-year Treasury Bonds decreased by 27 basis points to 1.45% for the quarter while the yield on thirty-year Treasury Bonds increased by 12 basis points to 4.95%. The spread between the one-year Treasury and the 30-year Treasury ended the quarter at 350 basis points compared to a 311 basis point spread at the end of last quarter. During the quarter, Certificates of Deposit experienced a decrease in yield for both the 180-Day maturities and 90-day maturities. Commercial Paper moved lower in the 30-day maturities, by 43 basis points, and decreased by 45 basis points in the 90-day maturities to 1.31%.



Portfolio Position

The portfolio maintained a weighted maturity of less than one year. Keeping the portfolio within this maturity range minimized its exposure to potential interest rate shifts that can occur in the mid-maturity sectors of the yield curve. The portfolio was oriented towards high quality with 44.4% of the portfolio's assets invested in risk-free instruments.

Compliance with California Government Codes 53601 & 53635:

The Investment Portfolio is compliant with the California Government Codes 53601 and 53635.

Compliance with Treasury Investment Pool Statement of Investment Policy:

The Statement of Investment Policy is more stringent than the California Government Code. As of 12/31/02, the Treasurer's Investment Pool portfolio complied with its Statement of Investment Policy.

Please refer to the next section of the report for a more detailed evaluation of the portfolio in relationship to the California Government Code and the Treasurer's Investment Pool Statement of Investment Policy.

Portfolio characteristics

The Treasury Pool's portfolio characteristics are indicative of a plan exhibiting a high degree of quality with short-term maturities.

- As of 12/31/02, the portfolio had a market value of \$1.6 billion with an average dollarweighted quality between "AA+" and "AAA".
- Approximately 44.4% of the portfolio's assets are invested in securities with virtually no credit risk (i.e., US Treasuries, US Agencies, and cash).
- The dollar weighted average life of the pool is 324 days.
- 37.1% of the portfolio at cost matures within 30 days, 41.6% matures within 90 days, and 49.8% within 180 days (see Appendix for further details).

Based on its relative high quality and near-term liquidity, and assuming no significant changes to pool funding policies, the Treasury Investment Pool is well positioned to meet its expenditure requirements over the next six months.






Portfolio Breakdown by Investment Type (valued at cost)

In the case of T-Fund, the maturity on a repo transaction can extend from 1 to 180 days, and only Treasury issues are accepted as eligible collateral. The securities are either held at PNC Bank, which acts as custodian in the case of deliverable repo, or maintained in the fund's name at the subcustodian bank in the case of tri-party repo. In the case of deliverable repo, the market value of each security is priced in house and verified by BIMC (BlackRock Institutional Management Corporation) through the use of electronic data from sources such as Bloomberg and Telerate. For tri-party repo, the market value of each security is priced by the sub-custodian bank. Such prices are then verified by BIMC through the aforementioned electronic data sources.

The margin requirement on all repo is 102% and every trade is priced daily. Should the market value on a term repo trade fall below that level, the original dealer is required to post additional collateral to restore the needed margin. A 7-day put option exists on all term trades.

To determine the fund's net asset value per share, the daily valuation of portfolio securities is performed in accordance with BIMC's matrix pricing policy. BIMC uses a matrix pricing methodology that is based on pricing tiers called matrix codes and time cells that extend out the yield curve. The matrix codes represent how a security trades relative to other securities of the same type. Security prices (yields) represent the bid side of the market and are indicative of where that security is expected to be able to sell. The security prices come from a variety of sources. The broker/dealers used are major participants in specific money market areas (e.g. Garban Ltd. for repurchase agreements).

Portfolio valuations are performed daily. Data is checked for accuracy by portfolio managers who are members of the matrix team. This data feeds the fund accounting system that determines the fund's net asset value per share. The variance to a \$1.00/share is noted and reported to the portfolio manager daily. Depending on market conditions, the number of matrix codes and the spread between tiers may change. These factors are reviewed periodically and changed as conditions warrant.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Average Maturity - The weighted average time to principal repayment. Useful as an approximation of a single maturity where the mean or average maturity is used to describe the life of the instrument.

Bankers Acceptance - Money market instrument created from transactions involving foreign trade. In its simplest form, a bankers acceptance is a check, drawn on bank by an importer or exporter of goods.

Basis Point - 1/100th of 1%.

Certificate of Deposit - A short term money market instrument representing a receipt from a bank for a deposit at a specified rate of interest for a specified period of time.

Coupon Rate - The annual interest paid of a fixed-income instrument.

Commercial Paper - Money Market instrument representing a short-term promissory note of a large corporation at a specified rate of return for a specified period of time.

Current Yield - A bond's coupon expressed as a percentage of the bond's market price.

Discount Rate - The interest rate used to translate a future value into a present value.

Duration - Often times referred to as Macaulay's duration is a fixed income measure of price sensitivity to changes in yields. It is calculated by taking a weighted average of the time periods to receipt of the present value of the cash flows from a fixed income instrument.

Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corporation - Also known as "FHLMC" and Freddie Mac. FHLMC is a Private Corporation authorized by Congress, which sells notes, participation certificates and other mortgage obligations backed by mortgage pools.

Federal National Mortgage Association - Also known as "FNMA" and Fannie Mae. A private corporation which buys and sells residential mortgages insured by FHA or guaranteed by VA. FNMA also issues notes, participation certificates and other mortgage obligations backed by mortgage pools.

Government National Mortgage Corporation - Also known as "GNMA" and Ginnie Mae. A wholly-owned U.S. government corporation. GNMA issues and guarantees mortgage-backed securities which are backed by the full faith and credit of the United States Government.

Repurchase Agreement - Short term collateralized loan at a specified rate for a specified period, used by large investors as an alternative for cash investments.

Yield to Maturity - The internal rate of return of a standard bond held to maturity.

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the State Center Community College District (the "District") previously adopted a Resolution requesting Fresno County, Madera County, Tulare County and Kings County (collectively, the "Counties") to call an election for general obligation bonds (the "Bond Election") to be held on November 5, 2002; and

WHEREAS, notice of the Bond Election was duly given; and on November 5, 2002, the Bond Election was duly held and conducted for the purpose of voting a measure for the issuance of bonds of the District in the amount of \$161,000,000 (the "Bond Measure"); and

WHEREAS, based on the statement of results for each of the Counties, more than fifty-five percent of the votes cast on the Bond Measure were in favor of issuing the aforementioned bonds.

WHEREAS, Section 15278 of the Education Code of the State of California provides that the governing board of a community college district shall establish and appoint members to an independent citizens' oversight committee, within 60 days of the date that the governing board enters the election results on its minutes; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the District wishes hereby to establish such independent citizens' oversight committee in connection with issuance of bonds under the Bond Measure and to appoint members thereto;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE STATE CENTER COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT DOES HEREBY FIND, DETERMINE AND CERTIFY AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. <u>Bond Election Results</u>. The Board of Trustees of the District has entered the results of the Bond Election results on its minutes within 60 days of the date of this Resolution.
- Section 2. <u>Authorization</u>. The Bond Measure was authorized pursuant to paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Section 1 of Article XIIIA of the California Constitution and subdivision (b) of Section 18 of Article XVI of the California Constitution in accordance with the requirements of the Strict Accountability in Local School Construction Bonds Act of 2000 (the "Act").
- Section 3. <u>Establishment of Committee</u>. An independent citizens' oversight committee (the "Committee") is hereby established for the purposes set forth in the Act.

Background:

In November 2001 the Board of Trustees authorized the administration to enter into negotiations with property owners for the acquisition of the preferred new educational center site at Willow/International. Subsequently, on February 5, 2002, the Board of Trustees approved the Environmental Impact Report and authorized the project.

During the past several months the District has entered into negotiations with various property owners based upon the value of the properties. In May 2002 the Board ratified acquisition of approximately 17.74 acres from the Bains/Dhillion group and in September 2002 the Board authorized purchase of 20.13 acres from the Aluisi family.

The District has recently concluded negotiations for the purchase of 73.93± acres from the Lion family at a cost of \$100,000 per acre for a total of \$7,393,000. The property owners have agreed to sell the property to the District under threat of condemnation, and it is in the best interest of the District to acquire the property in lieu of condemnation. The "me too" clause, which requires the District to compensate the Bains/Dhillon group any increased value agreed to with the remaining owners, has expired; therefore, it is not necessary to compensate them for the difference in the price per acre for the Lion property.

In order to finalize the acquisition, it is appropriate for the Board to approve the Resolution ratifying the Agreement for the purchase of real property located at the Willow/International site. In addition, it is recommended that the Board of Trustees authorize the Chancellor or the Vice Chancellor, Finance and Administration, to enter into a Purchase and Sale Agreement for said property.
