Mr. Zwi Reznik stated that the AFT is looking forward to a positive response from the Board regarding part-time faculty negotiations.

Recognition of FCC Men's Basketball Team and FCC Athletic Department Update Ms. Smith congratulated the men's basketball team for their efforts this year. She noted that she attended almost all of the games and she is very proud of the players, not only for their behavior, but their academic records as well.

Ms. Susan Yates, FCC Athletic Director, gave a brief update on the successes of the various sports teams and introduced the coaches and players in the audience.

Board members expressed their appreciation to the coaches and staff for the successful environment that has been created for the students.

Interim Chancellor's Report

Dr. Crow also offered his congratulations to the Fresno City College athletic program. A website on Measure E is being developed and will be ready for the Board's review at the June 3 Board meeting. He thanked Dr. Kershaw, Dr. Patterson, and webmaster Margarita Perez for their work on this project. Mr. Rowe and Ms. O'Hare have conducted the first two in a series of management workshops to discuss common issues. He commended the campuses and District Office staff for their efforts on the budget preparation, and noted the involvement that the campuses have had from the different constituent groups in the development and updating of the budget. The campuses are also identifying programs for closer scrutiny, looking at the production of the program and how it fits into the mission at their particular campus.

Measure E Update

Mr. Brinkley reported that the District has received the bond rating for Moody's. Moody's has a multi-tier rating system of AAA, AA, and A with a sub rating of 1, 2, and 3, with 1 being the highest. The AAA rating is reserved for agencies that have the ability to raise revenue or taxes independent of the State of California. Since the District relies upon state funds, the highest possible rating would be AA. The District's rating is AA3 for its first issue of \$20 million in bonds from Measure E.

It was a very elementary discussion and things that the District has been doing for years. He congratulated the District's financial team on their visionary efforts in this area.

Ms. Smith encouraged everyone to learn more about SB 6 and its effect on community colleges, as well as SB 20X, regarding the rating of the STRS program. She noted a petition being distributed by the *California Teacher* regarding a Budget Accountability Act. Ms. Smith also reported that for the third year in a row, she attended the Classified Professionals Mega Conference on April 16.

Mr. Patterson stated that one part of SB 6 deals with the governance issue and also affects the Academic Senates, and encouraged them to look into the matter.
