Background:

Fresno City College currently has a lease for two production copiers in the Copy Center that is set to expire in August 2006. In anticipation of this event, the print, media and communications staff and Business Office staff at Fresno City College have been working with the Purchasing Department to evaluate digital copiers of current technology to replace those coming off lease. Competing vendors were invited to submit proposals for production copier systems. Important features identified in the evaluation were speed, reliability, digital capability, and the ability to network copiers for on-line production.

After evaluation of the equipment and proposals, the Canon ImageRunner 7105 copiers were selected on the basis of performance, features and pricing as the best replacement for the current copiers. These copiers are available through several existing contracts but the contract most advantageous to the District is offered by DANKA Office Imaging through an Agreement between Riverside County and DANKA Office Imaging. This is an Agreement that was competitively bid and awarded by Riverside County and is currently used by a number of other agencies throughout the State to obtain excellent pricing on Canon products.

Lease costs for these high-speed digital production copiers will be on a monthly basis and include all maintenance and supplies except for paper. Monthly costs are projected to be \$3,458.24 based upon current copy volume and a five-year lease commitment. Both copiers include saddle stitch finishers, post process insert units, large-capacity paper decks and network print kits. Funding will be provided by General Fund monies at Fresno City College.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve participation in the Riverside County Agreement #RIVCO-60046-002-009-0904 with DANKA Office Imaging for the lease of two (2) digital production copiers at the Fresno City College Copy Center and authorize purchase orders to be issued against this Agreement.

Background:

For over three years the Center for International Trade Development (CITD) has been leasing office space at the UC Center, located at 550 East Shaw Avenue. The UC Center gathers many of the region's UC educational programs into this centralized facility and also partners with other non-profit organizations, such as the Regional Small Business Development Center, the County of Fresno Children and Families Commission, the Latino Issues Forum, and the Hmong Cultural Heritage Center. This has proven to be a positive location for CITD with the offering of compatible tenant programs, on-site accessibility of meeting rooms, computer training labs, availability of national and international video conferencing, and ample parking for customers and staff.

The District also leases space from the UC Center for operation of the State Center Consortium. While the CITD lease expires in July 2006, the Consortium lease will not expire until January 2007. The administration is recommending that the current CITD lease be extended by six months to coincide with the State Center Consortium lease. Lease rates of available office space located along Shaw Avenue close to the UC Center range from \$1.40 to \$1.50 per rentable square foot. While these facilities are comparable in price, they are commercial properties and don't offer the tenant compatibility of the other educational programs located at the UC Center or amenities such as video conferencing, available training labs, meeting rooms and economical high-speed internet access.

The current CITD lease agreement cost includes all utilities, security officer, alarm system, janitorial services and common area maintenance. The monthly cost of \$1,677.00 is based on \$1.50 per rentable square foot plus \$20.00 per month for a required Internet Protocol Address. The lease cost will be paid by current and future grants that support all costs of the Center for International Trade Development.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve a six (6) month lease extension with the Regents of the University of California for 1,118 square feet of space to house the Center for International Trade Development, located at 550 East Shaw, at a cost of \$1,677.00 per month, and authorize the Chancellor or Vice Chancellor, Finance and Administration, to sign the lease agreement on behalf of the District.
