Dr. Michele Cantwell-Copher, Executive Director of the SCCC Foundation, recognized a generous donation to the Foundation from PG&E last semester in the amount of \$5,000 for the Madera Center Disabled Student Programs and Services. She introduced Mr. Al Galvez, PG&E Public Affairs Manager, and presented him with a plaque on behalf of the Board of Directors of the Foundation, Chancellor Tom Crow, and the SCCC Board of Trustees, in appreciation for PG&E's generous support for the Disabled Student Programs and Services, Madera Center, State Center Community College District, 2006-2007. The donation encourages innovation and provides educational opportunities through access to technology for students at the Madera Center.

On behalf of the Board, Ms. Barreras thanked Mr. Galvez and PG&E for this generous gift, as well as similar gifts and efforts they have made in the past.

Chancellor's Report

Dr. Crow reported the following:

- The District will be honoring inductees to the SCCC Wall of Honor at the African American Historical and Cultural Museum in Fresno. This year the honorees are Dr. Ned Doffoney, Mr. Charles Francis and Ms. Anne Lopez Gaston. Also, Mr. Willie Perry will be honored posthumously. The event is Wednesday, February 28, at the Museum.
- The Workforce Development Summit Findings Report and Action Plan is complete and has been sent to the Summit

participants. Individual action plans from the campuses will be completed by March 1. The campus plans will be the result of the findings report and recommendations from the Summit participants. The action plans will center on the areas of class offerings, student support, program and curricular enhancement, marketing opportunities, partnerships, and contract education. Input will continue to be solicited from business and industry partners as the District moves forward with the career and technology education agenda. Summit findings can be found on the SCCC website.

- Governor Schwarzenegger's preliminary budget indicates that once again the Governor has demonstrated his support for community colleges, and more specifically, for career and technology education. There is going to be a considerable amount of funding for career and technology education with an emphasis on partnerships, especially with K-12. Staff will be working with the District's legislative representatives to assure a fair share of the funding. Dr. Crow is scheduled to meet one-on-one with elected officials to discuss issues of importance to the District. He will keep the Board informed as budget negotiations progress in Sacramento.
- The Third Annual Renaissance Feast to benefit the State Center Community College Foundation will be held on Saturday, March 10, at 6 p.m. in the historic Fresno City College Library. Last year's event was a huge success as evidenced, not only by the turnout, but by the dollars raised for student scholarships, which was nearly \$80,000. This year's feast promises to be another sellout so it is encouraged that tickets be acquired early.

Public comments were made by the following:

- Diane Garza-Ciarlante, Director of Public Affairs for the Coca-Cola Company based in Atlanta, Georgia, addressed the Board regarding concerns that arose at the last Board meeting about the Coca-Cola's Company's operations in Colombia and India, and general questions regarding the company's human rights policies. She stated she was present to assure the Board of the steadfast commitment to workers' rights, labor rights, and human rights. She gave some highlights of some of the

company's situations in both Colombia and India. In conclusion, she stated that since 2001 the company has been addressing these issues and they have been proven false time and again.

(Ms. Smith left at 5:24 p.m.)

- Mr. John Canfield, sales manager for the Coca-Cola Bottling Company in Fresno addressed the Board regarding the benefits of having an exclusive beverage partnership.

Mr. Brinkley spoke to the Board regarding the additional information the Board had requested. Item 07-15 is not an action item, but is for the Board's discussion and direction to staff.

Ms. Barreras asked how the net amount from the beverage contract is distributed to the colleges.

Mr. Patterson asked for an explanation of the full service commission.

Mr. Thonesen said that he hoped that this item can be completed this meeting or next. He would rather have a presentation and hear from the students on how education value can be improved. He was concerned that some of these issues needed to be resolved some place else.

Ms. Barreras expressed that the Board needs to remember that the students are the primary consumers, and she would like to take that into consideration when it comes to making any decision.

Mr. Rea said that instead of making one agreement for the entire district, how about letting each college choose.

Ms. Barreras responded that one of the things that is going to be suggested is that the campuses go back and decide on what they want to do and come back in March with their plans. The Board can possibly taken action then.

Mr. Patterson said he is concerned about human rights issues and thinks we have an obligation to be cognizant of the issues and take whatever action we can for our part to make sure that human rights throughout the world are adhered to and followed. He said that the Board did ask staff to examine the issue and to see if the Coca-Cola companies we are dealing with had anything to do with the human rights allegations, or if any of those allegations were true. He said that he has found nothing that would substantiate that those allegations were true. He said that our staff

thinks that the company negotiated in good faith and that we have what may be considered a good contract. He said he was prepared to make a motion.

Ms. Barreras reminded the Board that the item is for discussion only and that action could be taken at the March meeting.

Mr. Feaver said that we have listened to some students, but he said he was not sure how many students we are talking about—one class, or the whole campus.

Mr. Smith said that he agrees with Mr. Patterson in part with respect to the issue of human rights. However, he thought that the Board needed input from all constituencies, and that he was willing to listen to the constituencies before making a decision. He said he wants to be sure that there is input from everybody, especially the students because it affects them. If the students decide not go with an exclusive contract, they are going to lose money and the students have to understand that. Mr. Smith asked that there be some evidence about what the majority wants before the Board can make an ultimate decision.

Ms. Barreras stated the item will be on the agenda for the March Board Meeting, and the Board's recommendation is that the campuses go back and talk with their students, plan it out, and come back in March with what they want to do.

Mr. Forhan asked if the students were aware that this item was on the agenda tonight. Mr. Brinkley said they were aware.

Ms. Barreras said that the FCC Academic Senate wanted the opportunity to discuss this issue at Fresno City College.

Dr. Crow added that the Fresno City College Academic Senate has asked that a decision not be made at this meeting because they want to talk about it. He said that we also received some input from some students at Fresno City College and that they would like to defer it to the next meeting, as well.

I. Executive Summary

Introduction


This is the Compliance Review of the County of Fresno's Treasurer's Investment Pool Portfolio for the period ended December 31, 2006, pursuant to California Government Code 53646. The report has two primary objectives: (1) to provide information regarding portfolio holdings as to compliance with California Government Code Sections 53601 and 53635, as well as the County Treasurer's Statement of Investment Policy and (2) to detail portfolio characteristics of the portfolio's investment holdings.

Quarterly Overview of Markets:

During the quarter, the U.S. Treasury yield curve is slightly inverted while yields increased slightly across the entire maturity spectrum. The yields of shorter-term securities were higher than most long-term issues.

At both the October and December 2006 meetings, the Federal Reserve kept the funds rate unchanged at 5.25%. The Committee said economic growth has slowed over the course of the year, partly reflecting the substantial cooling of the housing market. Although recent indicators have been mixed, the economy seems likely to expand at a moderate pace on balance over coming quarters. Nonetheless, the Committee believes that some inflation risks remain, and therefore has kept open the possibility of a rate increase, depending on the evolution of the outlook for both inflation and economic growth.

As indicated on the previous page, during the fourth quarter of 2006, yields slightly increased across the entire maturity spectrum. The yield on one-year Treasury Bonds increased 9 basis points to 5.00%, while the yield on thirty-year Treasury Bonds increased 4 basis points to 4.81%. The spread between the one-year Treasury and the 30-year Treasury ended the quarter at 14 basis points, which is the same spread as the end of last quarter. During the quarter, yields on 90-day Certificates of Deposits remained the same, while 180-day maturity yields decreased 1 basis point. Commercial Paper decreased in the 30-day maturities by 6 basis points.

Portfolio Position

The portfolio maintained a weighted maturity of 16 months. The County of Fresno Investment Policy (revised December 2005) Section 11.0 recommends a portfolio of securities with a weighted average maturity not to exceed 550 days. Keeping the portfolio within this maturity range minimized its exposure to potential interest rate shifts that can occur in the mid-maturity sectors of the yield curve. The portfolio was oriented towards high quality with 61.9% of the portfolio's assets invested in risk-free instruments.

Compliance with California Government Codes 53601 & 53635:

The Investment Portfolio is compliant with the **California Government Codes 53601 and 53635**.

Compliance with Treasury Investment Pool Statement of Investment Policy:

The Statement of Investment Policy is more stringent than the California Government Code. As of 12/31/06, the Treasurer's Investment Pool portfolio complied with its Statement of Investment Policy.

Please refer to the next section of the report for a more detailed evaluation of the portfolio in relationship to the California Government Code and the Treasurer's Investment Pool Statement of Investment Policy.

Portfolio Characteristics

The Treasury Pool's portfolio characteristics are indicative of a plan exhibiting a high degree of quality with short-term maturities.

- As of 12/31/06, the portfolio had a market value of \$2.1 billion with an average dollar-weighted quality of "AAA."
- Approximately 61.9% of the portfolio's assets are invested in securities with virtually no credit risk (i.e., U.S. Agencies and cash).
- The dollar weighted average life of the pool is 480 days.
- 17.5% of the portfolio at cost matures within 30 days, 29.6% matures within 90 days, and 42.3% within 180 days (see Appendix for further details).

Based on its relative high quality and near-term liquidity, and assuming no significant changes to pool funding policies, the Treasury Investment Pool is well positioned to meet its expenditure requirements over the next six months.



As of December 31, 2006


Portfolio Breakdown by Investment Type (valued at cost)

To determine T-Fund's net asset value per share, the daily valuation of portfolio securities is performed in accordance with BIMC's matrix pricing policy.

BIMC uses a matrix pricing methodology that is based on pricing tiers called matrix codes, and time cells that extend out the yield curve.

The matrix codes represent how a security trades relative to other securities of the same type. Security prices (yields) represent the bid side of the market and are indicative of where Blackrock would expect to be able to sell that security.

Prices of repurchase agreements come from Bloomberg. BlackRock also checks the data against Broker/Dealers who are major participants in specific money market areas. IDC provides prices from Treasury bills, notes, and bonds.

Portfolio valuations are performed daily. Portfolio managers who are members of the matrix pricing team check data for accuracy. This data feeds the fund accounting system that determines the fund's net asset value per share. The variance to a \$1.00/share is noted and reported to the portfolio manager daily.

Depending on market conditions, the number of matrix codes and the spread between tiers may change. BlackRock reviews these factors periodically and change them as conditions warrant.

Fidelity performs daily mark-to-market of the holdings in the Fidelity Institutional Money Market Fund: Government Portfolio using IDC as its primary source. GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Average Maturity - The weighted average time to principal repayment. Useful as an approximation of a single maturity where the mean or average maturity is used to describe the life of the instrument.

Bankers Acceptance - Money market instrument created from transactions involving foreign trade. In its simplest form, a bankers acceptance is a check, drawn on bank by an importer or exporter of goods.

Basis Point - 1/100th of 1%.

Certificate of Deposit - A short term money market instrument representing a receipt from a bank for a deposit at a specified rate of interest for a specified period of time.

Coupon Rate - The annual interest paid of a fixed-income instrument.

Commercial Paper - Money Market instrument representing a short-term promissory note of a large corporation at a specified rate of return for a specified period of time.

Current Yield - A bond's coupon expressed as a percentage of the bond's market price.

Discount Rate - The interest rate used to translate a future value into a present value.

Duration - Often times referred to as Macaulay's duration is a fixed income measure of price sensitivity to changes in yields. It is calculated by taking a weighted average of the time periods to receipt of the present value of the cash flows from a fixed income instrument.

Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corporation - Also known as "FHLMC" and Freddie Mac. FHLMC is a Private Corporation authorized by Congress, which sells notes, participation certificates and other mortgage obligations backed by mortgage pools.

Federal National Mortgage Association - Also known as "FNMA" and Fannie Mae. A private corporation which buys and sells residential mortgages insured by FHA or guaranteed by VA. FNMA also issues notes, participation certificates and other mortgage obligations backed by mortgage pools.

Government National Mortgage Corporation - Also known as "GNMA" and Ginnie Mae. A wholly-owned U.S. government corporation. GNMA issues and guarantees mortgage-backed securities which are backed by the full faith and credit of the United States Government.

Repurchase Agreement - Short term collateralized loan at a specified rate for a specified period, used by large investors as an alternative for cash investments.

Yield to Maturity - The internal rate of return of a standard bond held to maturity.



STATEMENT OF PROGRESS REPORT PREPARATION

Since the college received formal notification of the Commission's action regarding Fresno City College's accreditation status in February 2006, it has pursued an aggressive agenda to address the five recommendations made by the Commission. The college continued with this agenda after the October 15, 2006, progress report and the October 31, 2006, campus visit.

The college received the response from the visiting team and the notification of commission action on February 2, 2007. The information has been communicated campuswide through President's Cabinet, the Academic Senate, the Classified Senate, the Associated Student Government, and the Strategic Planning Council. The planning committees were asked to prepare a response to the Commission's recommendations.

On February 12, 2007, Tom Crow, Chancellor of the State Center Community College District, Ned Doffoney, President of Fresno City College, and Tony Cantu, Vice President of Instruction and Accreditation Liaison at Fresno City College, had a telephone conference with Dr. Barbara Beno and Mr. Jack Pond of the Commission to discuss the Commission's action and to provide assistance in the preparation of the March 15, 2007, Progress Report.

A draft of the college's progress report was submitted to the Chancellor on February 26, 2007, and to the Board of Trustees on March 6, 2007. The draft was posted on Blackboard on February 27, 2007, for review and comment by the campus community. The report was mailed to the Commission and Dr. Michael Viera, chair of the visiting team, on March 9, 2007.

RESPONSE TO THE REQUEST OF THE COMMISSION

Recommendation 1 - Participatory Governance

The team recommends the college implement a participatory governance process to ensure that all constituent groups actively participate in the college's planning and decision making. (Standards IA.3, IB.1, IB.4)

Progress and Analysis:

The college has moved forward with implementing a participatory governance process that includes all constituent groups. During fall 2006 the Ad-hoc Shared Governance Council met two times a month and since November has met every week. The council's membership includes two administrators, two classified professionals, four faculty, and two students. The Ad-hoc Shared Governance Council has developed participatory governance principles, the duties and responsibilities for the permanent Shared Governance Council and a Fresno City College Governance/Communication Model (see Figure 1, page 9). These and the recommendation to create the permanent Shared Governance Council were submitted to all Fresno City College constituent groups on February 12, 2007. Upon constituent approval, the permanent Shared Governance Council will be constituted and the council's final operating agreement will be developed.

Results:

As referenced above, the work of the Ad-hoc Shared Governance Council has resulted in a set of participatory governance principles and duties and responsibilities to guide its work. The Fresno City College participatory governance principles permeate the campus:

- Participatory governance necessitates consistent, trustworthy communication that is multidirectional.
- Everyone has a right to provide input and have that input acknowledged.
- The participatory process is transparent and the status of any proposal shall be available to all constituencies at any point in the approval process.
- Decisions made through the participatory governance process shall be communicated along with the rationales to those directly affected.
- The degree of constituent involvement shall be directly related to the extent of the impact of the decision.
- Participants are responsible and accountable to their constituent groups in communication and execution of role.
- Decisions made through the participatory governance process necessitate joint commitment and support for implementation.
- These principles will be in compliance with:
 - Federal and state laws.
 - District and college policies.
 - Accreditation requirements.

The duties and responsibilities have been developed to provide focus to the work of the Shared Governance Council:

- Preside over collegewide committee development and oversight.
- Establish a framework of rules to drive committee activities.
- Monitor and coordinate collegewide shared governance activities (clearinghouse).
- Develop and submit a yearly activity report.
- Develop an operating agreement template for new campus committees.
- Establish a shared governance relationship with the District that fosters collaboration between the District and Fresno City College.
- Define “shared governance” and “participatory governance” as they are used at Fresno City College.
- Maintain participatory governance documentation for collegewide consumption
- Consider collegewide recommendations and concerns on shared governance.

The college implements participatory governance through the Strategic Planning Council (SPC), a decision making body with representation from all constituent groups (seven faculty, two students, five classified professionals, and four administrators), that coordinates the college’s strategic planning process. The scope and activities of the Strategic Planning Council include establishing college goals and objectives, establishing priorities for planning and resources, monitoring the progress towards the completion of college goals and objectives, analyzing unit Action Plans, developing and prioritizing resources, and submitting annual progress reports. Decisions are made through consensus.


Future Plans:

The college continues to make significant progress in addressing this recommendation and will fully meet the accreditation standard before the end of the spring 2007 semester. Once the constituent groups consider and approve the recommendation of the Ad-hoc Shared Governance Council in early March 2007, the permanent council will be constituted and an operating agreement developed. The college expects that the council will be functioning before the end of the spring 2007 semester.

Recommendation 2 - Program Review

The team recommends that the college develop and implement a workable systematic program review model that incorporates consideration of the college's financial resources. The college should work to create a program review model that is embraced by all college constituents. (Standards IB, IIA, IIB, IID.3)

Progress and Analysis:

The program review process developed during the spring 2006 semester has been fully implemented. The Program Review Committee read, evaluated, and accepted 33 instructional and one non-instructional program reviews in fall 2006. The final reports and committee action are available on the Blackboard website. The remaining 24, including 18 non-instructional program reviews, have already been scheduled for review during the Spring 2007 semester. The committee began meeting on February 13, 2007 to take action on program reviews.

The instructional program review process piloted in spring 2006 has been modified by a sub-committee of the Program Review Committee, presented to campus constituencies, and fully adopted. The Program Review Committee also developed an operating agreement to ensure consistency and make its purpose and charge clear to the campus community.

Thirty-two new programs have begun their program reviews this spring. To facilitate the process, there was a mandatory training workshop on March 2, 2007. During the workshop, the Coordinator of Program Review led the discussion of the purpose of program review, the components and format for the preparation of the program review, the data sets for each program, the program review flowchart, and the calendar. Each of the programs received data sets and an electronic template for their program from the Institutional Research Coordinator. Facilitators were also available to provide one-on-one guidance in getting started on the program review. A follow-up workshop will be conducted on April 13, 2007, so that programs can report on progress to date and/or receive additional assistance in completing their program review. Semi-final drafts will be due on May 7, 2007, for review and comment by the coordinator before final submission.

Results:

The college is fully implementing program review into college planning processes. During fall 2006, the Program Review Committee forwarded 22 recommendations to the Strategic Planning Council (SPC) Support Team. The Support Team then sent the recommendations to the appropriate committees. As a result of the recommendations, four new faculty positions were funded, \$97,000 was spent on instructional equipment, and funds for an IDEA lab for the Fine, Performing and Communication Arts Division were allocated. Recommendations for smart classrooms, standardization of classroom clickers, and other technology have been referred to the Technology Advisory Committee.

Future Plans:

Discussion regarding the most appropriate way to evenly distribute the programs over a five-year period to avoid overloading the committee has begun. The Coordinator of Program Review, the Curriculum Committee Chair, and the Vice President of Instruction have begun discussion to align the program review process with the five-year curriculum review process so that program review results and recommendations will play a greater role in curriculum planning.

Recommendation 3 – Planning

Given the lack of progress in meeting the recommendation for planning from the last accreditation report , the team strongly recommends the college develop a planning process that integrates budgeting, program review, technology and distance education, and human resources planning, including hiring, evaluations and staff development. This process should be based upon objective analysis of the current situation and a forecast of future circumstances. (Standards IIA, IIB, IIIA, IIIC, IIID)

Progress and Analysis:

At the opening day meeting of the spring 2007 semester, the college was presented with an update of the progress of the 2006-2008 Strategic Plan.

The Strategic Planning Council (SPC) and the Support Team have been meeting at regular intervals. Since the October 15, 2006, the SPC has met seven times and the Support Team has met eight. Currently, the SPC meets twice a month with the Support Team meeting on alternate weeks. Agenda items have included environmental scan information, reports on planning committees, and review of the college's goals.

A central theme to the Strategic Planning process has been the development of the action plan. Campuswide training on developing action plans occurred late in the fall 2006 semester. There were six sessions in which over 100 people received training. Training for the spring 2007 semester will be scheduled by the end of the February. Several action plans are in the development phase; and to date, two action plans have been approved by the SPC.

The various planning committees are either developing or reviewing their operating agreements. The Distance Education Committee, for example, has had its operating agreement approved by the constituent groups. Department chairs, however, have decided not to become a planning committee at this time.

At the SPC meetings of January 25 and February 8, 2007, the council reviewed the 2006-2007 College goals. The 2006-2008 Strategic Plan goals and objectives that will provide a focus for college units for the 2007-2008 academic year were developed and prioritized:

1. FCC will effectively provide quality services to our community (Goal 1).
2. The college will improve its orientation and registration for first time students regardless of entry point (Goal 2 Objective 2.1).
3. The college will increase student persistence of first time students through two semesters of their educational plan (Goal 2 Objective 2).
4. The college will improve the depth and breadth of programs and services to meet learner needs (Goal 2 Objective 2.3).
5. The college will increase its transfer rates, degree completions, certificate awards, and job placement rates (Goal 2 Objective 2.4).

6. FCC will provide broad access to programs and services (Goal 3).
7. The college will improve communication and collaboration among all constituencies in the campus community (Goal 5 Objective 5.1).
8. The college will promote activities on the campus that build community (Goal 5 Objective 5.2).
9. FCC will partner with educational, business, and other local community organizations (Goal 6).
10. The college will improve its marketing strategies (Goal 7 Objective 7.2).
11. The college will collaborate with SCCCD on program development (Goal 8 Objective 8.1).
12. The college will collaborate with SCCCD on program implementation and expansion (Goal 8 Objective 8.2).

These goals have been submitted to the Chancellor and will be reviewed at a Board of Trustees Retreat in March.

Scott Epstein, one of the consultants from the Datatel Center for Institutional Effectiveness, conducted workshops on February 7 and 8, 2007 with the SPC and the Support Team. The purpose of the workshops was to begin evaluation of the strategic planning process to date. The operating agreement for the SPC states that an “[...] evaluation of the SPC and its processes will be conducted by the SPC and include input from the college constituent groups by the end of March.” The evaluation of the effectiveness of the SPC will include but not be limited to meeting attendance, membership, progress toward the accomplishment of stated goals and objectives, and member satisfaction. The evaluation of the effectiveness of the strategic planning process will include but not be limited to progress toward the accomplishment of stated planning goals and objectives and campus and community satisfaction. At the February workshops, the SPC members agreed to evaluate themselves and the members of the Support Team, even though the Strategic Plan and the processes have been in place for only one semester. The council agreed by consensus to complete the initial evaluation.

Results:

The college continues to make significant progress in addressing this recommendation. The FCC 2006-2008 Strategic Plan is being implemented. The SPC and the Support Team continue to meet on a regular basis. Planning committees have made significant progress in completing operating agreements that have either been approved or are being reviewed by constituent groups. The Support Team has conducted training on the development of action plans. College goals and objectives for 2007-2008 have been developed. The initial evaluation of the strategic planning process, including the SPC and the Support Team, has begun and will provide valuable constituent input for both the SPC and Support Team. The SPC will use the results of this evaluation to improve the planning process.

Future Plans:

- Complete and communicate to the constituent groups the initial evaluation of the strategic planning process and of the SPC.

- Continue to conduct action plan training.
- Receive progress reports on approved action plans.
- Communicate college goals and objectives for the 2007-2008 academic year.

Recommendation 3.1 - The team recommends that the college develop a process that provides regular and systematic evaluations of its entire staff (faculty, classified, administration, management). (Standard IIIA)

Progress and Analysis:

As stated in the October 15, 2006 progress report, the college began addressing this recommendation prior to receipt of the Commission's action on the college's accreditation. In December, the college president requested an update on the status of all employee evaluations. Senior administrators were directed to submit this information prior to the end of the fall 2005 semester. Additionally, all management evaluations were completed and submitted to the president by January 31, 2006.

To ensure that all evaluations are completed in accordance with the procedure outlined in Article XIII, Section 1 of the AFT agreement; in Article 29 of the CSEA agreement; Board Policy 4315 (a) Academic Management Assignment, Evaluation and Tenure; and Board Policy 4315.3, Classified Management/Confidential Performance Evaluation, senior administrators are now required to submit the status of all employee evaluations for their areas at the end of each semester to the college president for his review. The format for reporting the status of employee evaluations was approved by President's Cabinet in April 2006.

Results:

This recommendation has been fully addressed. Evaluations of classified professionals, faculty, and managers are now up to date and conform to the process and procedure outlined in the bargaining agreements and board policies. Evidence of the currency of staff evaluations is available in the president's office.

Future Plans:

The status of all evaluations will be submitted to the college president at the end of each fall and spring semester. This will ensure that all evaluations are conducted in a systematic manner and will continue to provide evidence that evaluations remain current and follow established policies and procedures.

Recommendation 3.2 - The team recommends that the college develop a distance education plan to guide a more concerted effort for online courses and supplemental online instructional support services (Standards IIA.1d, IIA.1b, IIA.2d).

Progress and Analysis:

As reported in the October 15, 2006, progress report, the Distance Education Committee has been constituted and has developed an operating agreement approved by the constituencies and the Strategic Planning Council. The Committee has met since the submission of the October progress report. Meetings of the committee are scheduled every other week, and all agendas and minutes of meetings are posted on Blackboard. Subcommittees on online instructor evaluation, online orientation, and distance education plan that were formed during the fall semester continue to meet and report to the committee.

Results

The college is fully addressing this recommendation. The first online instructor evaluation form (peer evaluation form) has been produced by the subcommittee, approved by the Distance Education Committee, and submitted to and approved by the Academic Senate Instruction Committee.

The Online Orientation Subcommittee has researched a plethora of orientations from other institutions and determined that the college needs not just a student readiness quiz but also a tutorial. Our research led us to Santa Barbara City College's online orientation, and we have received their permission to adapt it for our use.

As part of the committee's development of a Distance Education Plan, the FCC Distance Education Guidelines have been finalized with input from Reedley College. Those Guidelines have been submitted to the Academic Senate for first reading at its meeting of February 28, 2007.

The Distance Education Plan Subcommittee has also produced a draft Distance Education Plan which has been reviewed and approved by the entire Distance Education Committee. The final draft has been submitted to the Academic Senate for first reading at the February 28, 2007, meeting.

One aspect of distance education the committee felt was vital to our future is developing our own online teacher training program. The college has been relying primarily on training online instructors via the Cerro Coso Community College certificate program. The Distance Education Committee has developed an FCC online teacher training program to be offered to FCC faculty as well as any other instructors interested in teaching online. This program, which will begin in the fall of 2007, consists of a nine-unit certificate program to be completed over a 16-week schedule.

Future Plans:

The Distance Education Committee agenda for the spring 2007 semester includes

- submission of the student evaluation form to the Instruction Committee of the Academic Senate for review and comment;
- development of an online orientation for distance education students;
- completion of the FCC Distance Education Guidelines and coordination with Reedley College to help establish district wide guidelines; and
- completion of the development of the Online Teacher Training Program for implementation in Fall, 2007.

The Distance Education Committee will meet during the spring 2007 semester on March 1, March 15, March 29, April 19, and May 3. Items for future agendas include 1) the development of an online instructor handbook, 2) development of a standardized procedure for taking attendance and dropping no-show students, 3) creation of a distance education webpage, and 4) a recommendation for a Distance Education Director position.

Recommendation 3.3 - The team recommends that the college integrate human resources planning into the collegewide institutional planning process. (Standard IIIA)

Progress and Analysis:

As part of the strategic planning process, the Strategic Planning Council (SPC) acknowledged the need for the creation of a committee that would consider recommendations from program review, action plans, and other planning committees for the allocation of human resources. An ad-hoc human resources committee was formed late in the fall 2006 semester to develop an operating agreement for a permanent Human Resources Committee that would identify human resource needs, evaluate human resources proposals, and prioritize human resource allocations incorporating program review, budget information, and strategic planning. The ad-hoc committee has been meeting since November 9, 2006.

Results:

The college has made significant progress in addressing this recommendation since the October 15, 2006, progress report. At its February 27, 2007, meeting, the ad-hoc Human Resources Committee finalized an operating agreement that will be forwarded to the constituent groups for review and comment.

Future Plans:

Once the constituent groups and the SPC have approved the operating agreement for the human resources committee, the permanent committee will be constituted and begin meeting. The committee will be operational before the end of the spring 2007 semester.

Recommendation 3.4 -The team recommends that the college implement a technology plan that coordinates with the district technology plan, and is fully integrated with program review. (Standard IIC.2)

Progress and Analysis:

Since the October 15, 2006, progress report, the Technology Advisory Committee (TAC) has continued to meet on a regular basis. It has met seven times since then and continues to meet every two weeks to consider technology related recommendations from program review, develop action plans for campus technology, and review districtwide recommendations from the district Technology Coordinating Committee (TCC)

Results:

As the activities listed below indicate, the college is fully addressing this recommendation. Since the October 31, 2006, site visit the TAC has

- approved the 2006-2008 Campus Technology Plan and distributed it to the various constituency groups for review and comment;
- developed a recommendation form for submission to the SPC for all recommendations that come from the planning groups on campus;
- forwarded three recommendations of eight made by the Program Review Committee for technology: 1) The IDEA Lab for the Fine Performing Communication Arts division, 2) Replacement computers for the Journalism program in the RAMPAGE newspaper office, and 3) a Unit Action Plan for a Classroom Response System standard for the campus;
- developed and submitted a Unit Action Plan to address several program review recommendations and Goal #2 & 12 (Audio/Visual Capabilities in every classroom and "SMART" classroom) from the 2006-2008 Campus Technology Plan; and
- completed a year-end progress report for the 2006-2008 Technology Plan Goals reviewed the Distance Education Plan and provided feedback to the DE committee.

Additionally, several members of the TAC, including the Director of Technology, continue to work with district information systems and the representatives from the other campuses on the TCC and the District Technology Plan. The Directors of Technology (FCC and Reedley) and the Information Systems Director meet weekly to discuss technology issues and develop procedures to standardize hardware, establish security polices for internal and external access to the network, wireless access availability, distance education technology requirements, server replacement/consolidation and storage, and other technology related topics.

Future Plans:

The Committee will continue working on the goals established in the Campus Technology Plan with emphasis on the following items:

- Data Recovery and Storage policies and procedures
- Increasing Wireless Access on Campus
- Assuring Accessibility to Computer Labs

- Establishing Remote Access procedures
- Redesigning the Fresno City College Web site
- Securing Additional Support Personnel
- Establishing a technology fee for students

Recommendation 5 - Districtwide Recommendation

The team recommends that the college continue to develop, implement, and evaluate a collegewide strategic plan that 1) incorporates the individual planning efforts of the college and 2) results in a cohesive planning framework. Simultaneously, the college should remain cognizant of the strategic development of the State Center Community College District as it moves toward increasing the number of colleges in the district. (Standards IB.2, IB.3, IB.4, IVB, IVB.2, IVB.3, IVB.3f)

Progress and Analysis:

In order to develop an integrated strategic planning process that would help position the college to better meet both its current and future needs while at the same time address Accreditation Recommendation 3, the college contracted with the Datatel Institute for Institutional Effectiveness. The consultants, Burt Peachy and Scott Epstein, met with the the Strategic Planning Council on March 16, 2006, to go over the process and timeline for the development of the college's strategic plan. One of the consultants, Burt Peachy, had facilitated the development of Reedley College's 2002-2005 strategic plan. Additionally, he and Scott Epstein are also serving as consultants to Reedley College as it updates it strategic plan. The district's strategic plan is operational through 2007 and the process of developing a new strategic plan has begun. These same consultants will assist in the development of a new district strategic plan. The goal is that by January 2008, Fresno City College, Reedley College, and the North Centers will have separate, yet linked, strategic plans coordinated with the new district strategic plan. The District Board of Trustees will approve all final strategic plans.

In response to this district recommendation, Chancellor Tom Crow formed a District Office Accreditation Planning and Facilities Committee in February 2006 to begin identifying elements to be used to determine district support in the areas of classified staffing, utilities, insurance, and both instructional and non-instructional supplies and materials. The committee met four times during the spring 2006 semester and developed preliminary custodial/maintenance/grounds and clerical staffing guidelines taking into account unique factors at each site, including instructional programs, athletic fields, child development centers, age and condition of buildings, student enrollment, police, and pending remodeling and/or new construction.

Results:

The college is working with the district to address this recommendation. The district committee has laid the ground work for the discussions that will need to take place in order to address the issues and concerns associated with growth. To that end, the district committee has been expanded and now includes the vice presidents of administrative services, vice presidents of instruction, representatives from the academic and classified senates, and representatives from each of the colleges' and centers' strategic planning-type committees.

The expanded committee had its first meeting on October 17, 2006 to assess the current levels of classified staffing at each location and to begin strategizing for the fall 2007 opening of the Willow and International expansion of the Clovis Center, the 2009 opening of the Madera Center vocational wing, the 2009 completion of the Old Administration Building modernization project,

the 2012 opening of the Southeast Center and other projects not yet funded. The inclusion of representatives from each of the site's strategic planning committees will provide the necessary coordination among the District, Fresno City College, Reedley College, and the North Centers.

At a meeting held on January 31, 2007, Brian Speece, Associate Vice Chancellor for District Operations, made a PowerPoint presentation to update the committee on the status of the different projects in the district. The discussion also included the proposed programs for some of the sites and the resource implications that these projects had for the district and the colleges and centers.

Future Plans:

The college will continue to collaborate with district as it moves toward increasing the number of colleges in the district.

Recommendation 5: Library and Learning Resources

The team recommends that the college fully implement the previous team's recommendation by ensuring that professionally qualified library and learning resource staff provide support at all locations where these services are offered currently and will be needed as future centers and campuses are developed. (Standards II.C.1a, II.C.1b, II.C.1c, II.C.2)

Progress and Analysis

The college's October 15, 2006, Progress Report indicated that the North Centers faculty, staff, and administrators, through the formal governance process, recommended the hiring of a full-time librarian as the top priority for fall 2007. The Progress Report also detailed the new professional staff members hired at the Reedley College location and at the North Centers to augment existing staff.

The October 15, 2006, Progress Report also described under "Future Plans" that a job announcement for the North Centers' librarian position would be developed and would be disseminated in early 2007. These plans have been implemented as follows:

1. Librarian Position Job Announcement

As shown in the attached document, the State Center Community College District- North Centers is in the process of recruiting for a full time Librarian (Position #4538) effective August 09, 2007. The Librarian position announcement application deadline was Friday, February 23, 2007.

2. Librarian Position Faculty Interview Selection Committee-

Members of the North Centers' Library Advisory Committee comprise the Librarian Position Faculty Interview Selection Committee and have been trained in the policies and procedures for recruitment and employment of college faculty as well as Equal Employment Opportunity Commission guidelines and procedures. In addition, the Librarian Position Faculty Interview Selection Committee met on February 23, 2007, and completed the following items as per the State Center Community College Administrative Regulations on the procedures for recruitment and employment of college faculty:

- a. Reviewed the charge of the committee.
- b. Reviewed the standards for applicant screening and interview selection.
- c. Developed a brief list of core questions to be asked of each candidate.
- d. Identified and outlined appropriate teaching demonstrations, writing sample, or other performance indicators related to the subject deemed necessary of each applicant.

- e. Reviewed the Equal Employment Opportunity action goals and guidelines with the District Equal Employment Opportunity Officer.

The Faculty Interview Selection Committee will interview prospective candidates in March 2007 and will forward the top three applicants to the Vice Chancellor North Centers who will then select and recommend the finalist to the Chancellor and Board of Trustees for full time tenure track employment with the State Center Community College District beginning August 09, 2007. (See attached membership list).

3. Willow International Community College Center-

Phase one of the Willow International Community College Center will open in August 2007 on the 110 acre site and will include an 80,000 square foot academic center that will include a 2,167 square foot library facility. Phase Two, scheduled to begin construction next year with an opening in 2010, will house a 9,000 square foot comprehensive Library/Learning Resource Center (see attached plans).

The college has made a total commitment to the hiring of a full time librarian and appropriate learning resource services for the North Centers as planned.

Background:

At the November Board meeting District administration presented the results of a Request for Proposal (RFP) for exclusive pouring rights of drink products. The administration recommended to the Board that District staff be authorized to enter into an exclusive vending agreement with Coca-Cola. This recommendation was based upon the District's previous experience that an exclusive partnership with a single soft drink company has proven to be a increased source of revenue for colleges/centers to supplement funding for special activities and functions. In exchange for contractual payments and/or commissions to the District, the soft drink vendor is granted exclusive pouring rights at all campus facilities. This generally includes cafeteria services, vending and athletics. The District granted these pouring rights to Coca-Cola under a contract that began in 2001 and expired in 2006.

Proposals were received from the Coca-Cola Bottling Company of California and from Pepsi Bottling Group, San Joaquin, for a new five-year pouring rights contract. The responses have been evaluated by campus and District administration in regard to service, product price, commission and sponsorship funding. Both proposals use a variety of methods to compensate the District for pouring rights, including sponsorship funds, scholarships, commissions, rebates, marketing funds and free product. While both firms have a proven track record of service and support in the Central Valley, analysis of the proposals indicates a financial advantage to the proposal received from Coca-Cola. Key components of the Coca-Cola proposal include: 1) sponsorship funding to support student activities; 2) necessary equipment for cafeteria and vending operations; 3) continuous vending commissions and rebates; 4) scholarship funding; and 5) competitive pricing for cafeteria, athletic and retail sales.

At November meeting students and faculty raised the question of human rights issues regarding Coca-Cola and the possibility of having a choice of product versus a single vendor. Following these statements the Board directed the administration to investigate some of the allegations made by students and faculty regarding Coca-Cola. The results from this investigation were presented to the Board at the February meeting.

The investigation revealed that there were a number of internet commentaries and publications by several non-governmental agencies related to these two alleged situations (Colombia and India). In both cases there does not seem to be any outstanding court or legal issues facing Coca-Cola or the affiliate franchises. The Coca-Cola producers in Colombia and India are both affiliated to Coca-Cola through a franchise arrangement and are not owned by Coca-Cola. It appears the accusations are from individuals or groups not associated with governmental agencies. A Coca-Cola representative confirmed this at the February meeting. It was further discovered that Coca-Cola is a member of the United Nations Global Compact, which has principles similar to those held by other similar organizations, such as Amnesty International.

The Board asked the Colleges/Centers to meet with their constituency groups to gather additional information. The President or Vice Chancellor of each College/Center has provided the following information for the Board's information.

Fresno City College:

The Academic Senate could not agree on the resolution because they could not agree on the "whereases" that lead to the resolve. The points of view are as varied as the instructors that sit on the Senate. Some believe the human rights have been violated, some that there are only allegations that cannot be proven, and some feel that this is traveling down a slippery slope which could end by banning different products right and left. Although not unanimous, the majority of the Senate did agree that the Board should not renew the exclusive vending contract with Coca-Cola and not to enter into an exclusive pouring rights agreement with any bottling company.

The Fresno City College Strategic Planning Council supports the Board of Trustees completing contracts with more than one major beverage vendor at FCC.

The Associated Student Government has already informed the Board, they wish to have more than one vendor.

North Centers:

The Associated Student Body Executive Board has stated that they wish to stay with the exclusive contract with Coke.

The Institutional Oversight and Budget Committee, representing certificated, administrative and classified leaders, supported the students on the choice for Coke.

Reedley College:

The Academic Senate stated that they do not have a position on the pouring rights issue.

The Classified Senate stated that they are in support of an exclusive pouring rights agreement.

The Associated Student Body has indicated they prefer an exclusive contract.

Coca-Cola has proven to be a supportive partner to the District and its students. Renewal of this contract with Coca-Cola will allow for a seamless move to the new five-year period without disruption to the current programs and equipment in place. As in the past, the funding received

from this pouring rights contract will not be held or used at the District level. Revenue received is distributed proportionally to all campuses. The campuses use these monies to fund student clubs, field trips, equipment, scholarships and other activities.

After reviewing the information presented at the various meeting and research from various sources, the administration believes the proper decision is to renew the exclusive pouring rights agreement with Coca-Cola and recommends the Board authorize the District to enter into such an agreement.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees authorize a Districtwide Pouring Rights Agreement with Coca-Cola Bottling Company of California for a period of five years, and authorize the Chancellor or Vice Chancellor, Finance and Administration, to finalize and sign an agreement on behalf of the District.

Background:

Bid #0607-07 provides for the seismic renovation of the one-story building at the Clovis Center campus. The work of this project consists of selective demolition to various existing partitions, casework, and ceilings, the construction of structural modifications to existing systems, and the repair and bracing of these systems. Additional modifications to existing ceiling systems will be required with the re-installation of ceiling-mounted components including fire alarm systems, mechanical and electrical systems in support of the new facility. This project is necessitated by the need to comply with state architectural requirements for seismic safety. The work of this project will be scheduled to provide continued use of the facility so that existing classrooms will remain in service during construction.

Funding for this project will be provided by the 2006-07 Capital Project Fund. Bids were received from four (4) contractors as follows:

Background:

Bid #0607-16 provides for parking lot and pavement improvements at various locations at Fresno City College, Reedley College and the Oakhurst Center. Pavement rehabilitation has typically been an annual project, utilizing funds from parking lot revenues to maintain the paved surfaces throughout the District. The work of this project at Fresno City College includes the complete renovation of Parking Lot F (south of the underpass and west of the railroad), new striping and signage for Parking Lot G (fronting Applied Technology), and new center line striping of Weldon Avenue from the District Office to Campus Drive. Also included and funded separately by Decision Package Funds is the construction of a new sidewalk along Campus Drive. The renovation of Parking Lot F will create an additional 31 spaces for student parking. The work at Reedley College includes the complete renovation of the rear section of Campus Drive from the landscape horticulture buildings to the cafeteria. At the Oakhurst Center the work includes the complete renovation of the campus parking lot and the installation of additional storm drainage improvements. All work will be scheduled for completion during the summer months to allow for minimum disruption to District activities.

Additional work to be performed at Fresno City College Parking Lot E (adjacent to Parking Lot F) was rejected as the price exceeded budget estimates by a significant amount. This portion of the work will be reevaluated and bid with next year's rehabilitation project.

Funding for this project will be provided by a combination of Districtwide parking fee revenues and 2006-07 Decision Package Funds for Fresno City College. Bids were received from five (5) contractors as follows:

Background:

The City of Reedley has been in the process of developing a trail adjacent to the railroad tracks in Reedley which would run westerly along the rails to the river. The College and District staffs have been meeting with City representatives to determine the feasibility of the trail between the railroad tracks and the College. The City currently owns a 30-foot wide right-of-way between the rails and the College several hundred feet back from the river where the City plans to terminate the path with a gazebo structure. The City is missing right-of-way from Manning Avenue to this 30-foot wide piece of right-of-way. The City has requested the District to consider dedicating a 20-foot wide right-of-way from Manning to the City's right-of-way. The advantages to the District from a pure development component are:

- Removal of the oleander bushes along the south side of the campus;
- Installation of a bike/walk trail along the south side of the campus from Manning Avenue to the river, which will include such amenities and services as:
 - installation of new landscaping with irrigation system;
 - trail and landscaping maintained by the City;
 - installation of lighting along the trail;
 - development of a cross-walk with in-pavement lighting system across Manning Avenue;
 - steel guard posts at entrance to inhibit vehicle traffic;
 - functional and decorative fencing to separate the trail from the campus.

This project, as designed, is a \$661,000 investment by the City for this portion of the trail. It will enhance the southern side of the campus. The proposed right-of-way dedication is 20 feet wide for a distance of 1,030 feet, or slightly less than 0.5 acre. This is a positive investment into the community of Reedley, as well as a tremendous enhancement to the south side of Reedley College.

Campus Perspective of Project:

There are numerous benefits to Reedley College in the completion of the City of Reedley's Rails to Trails project. The trail is planned to parallel the railroad tracks on the south side of the campus. This area of the campus poses problems for the College because it is aesthetically unappealing and difficult to secure because of the landscaping bordering it and the fact that there is no lighting. The proposed trail would mitigate these issues and provide additional benefits to the College as follows:

- Improved Security – The project will include removal of the oleanders and other landscaping that make it difficult, if not impossible, to have good visibility of the area. The project will also include lighting along the trail which is greatly needed. These items are a significant improvement in our ability to properly secure this area of the campus.
- Public Access – The project will allow controlled access to the trail both by the public and by College personnel and students. It is good to have people from our communities on the campus, and the trail will provide a way for people to see our campus, enjoy the amenities we offer, and have a safe route to enjoy the Kings River. The trail will make the baseball facility more easily accessible.
- Aesthetics – The area identified for the extension of the trail is in need of redesign and new landscaping. The railroad tracks and the non-campus buildings bordering this side of the campus are not aesthetically pleasing, and the completion of the trail, as proposed by the City of Reedley, will greatly improve this area of the campus. The design of the trail, the landscaping, the block/wrought iron fencing, and the Kings River overlook structure will provide significant improvement that is greatly needed in this area of the campus.
- The City of Reedley will provide all maintenance and upkeep of the trail, the fencing, the lighting, and the landscaping.

This project is a win-win project for both Reedley College and the City of Reedley.

At the February 6, 2007, Board meeting the Board approved Resolution No. 07-5 signifying the District's intention to dedicate right-of-way to the City of Reedley for the City's Trail project and scheduled a public hearing for this matter for 4:30 p.m. on Tuesday, March 6, 2007.

The Board President should hold a public hearing and solicit public comments regarding the dedication. If there are no protests at the public hearing scheduled on this matter, Resolution No. 2007-6 should be adopted authorizing dedication of the right-of-way described in the Resolution and authorize the Chancellor or Vice Chancellor, Finance and Administration, to execute the necessary documents for the conveyance of the right-of-way to the City of Reedley.

AGREEMENT FOR THE DEDICATION OF RIGHT-OF-WAY

State Center Community College District, hereby known as Grantor, owner of Assessor's Parcel Nos. 368-360-03 and 363-100-59, currently Reedley College, located at 995 North Reed Avenue in the City of Reedley, does hereby grant to the City of Reedley (Grantee) by the execution of this Agreement an ingress and egress easement across the south 40 feet of said parcel for the purpose of installing, in general, a new storm drain line and filtration system, and the next phase of the Reedley Parkway to include bike trail, lighting, fencing, river overlook gazebo, landscaping and irrigation.

Grantor further agrees to convey by Grant Deed the south 20 feet of Assessor's Parcel No. 368-360-03 as right-of-way to the Grantee as further described in Exhibit "A" and as shown in Exhibit "B". Grantor acknowledges and agrees that said right-of-way is hereby conveyed by the Grantor to the Grantee at no cost to the Grantee for the benefit of the Reedley Parkway, Reedley College, and the community at large.

The Grantee does hereby agree to the following conditions and/or understandings:

- a. Prior to the issuing of the Notice to Contractors for the construction of the Parkway, SCCCDC and the City of Reedley will review and mutually agree upon the Parkway plans.
- b. The cost of the Parkway construction along with the cost of repairing or restoring any and all damage to College property (irrigation systems, lawn, etc.) will be the sole responsibility of and paid for by the Grantee.

A 20.00 foot wide strip of land situated in the City of Reedley, County of Fresno, State of California, lying within the Northwest Quarter of Section 27, Township 15 South, Range 23 East, Mount Diablo Base and Meridian more particularly described as follows:
