Public Comment

Tate Hill, Central Valley Business Diversity Partnership/President Fresno Metro Black Chamber of Commerce – Mr. Hill spoke to items 16-36 and 16-82G. He stated that he believes the district needs a more robust procurement/supplier policy. He has concerns about bond RFP processes. He has concerns about how the members of the Citizens’ Bond Oversight Committee are selected.

Tim Wilson – Mr. Wilson lives near Fresno City College. He spoke to items 16-81G, 16-82G and 16-36. He expressed concerns regarding the RFPs relating to 16-81G and 16-82G. Regarding 16-36, Bond Oversight Committee, he is perplexed by the committee’s function. He thinks it’s odd to wait until projects are done before they go before the committee. He thinks it is more prudent to take them before the committee in the beginning. He is also concerned about how the committee will be established in relation to the committee for Measure E.

Robert Skowronski – Mr. Skowronski passed out copies of *The Fresno Bee* article of June 16, 2016, to the board. He wanted to state that he is not in any way connected to anyone related to the article. He stated his concern about the incident described in the article. He offered some suggestions for remedying the situation. President Caglia invited him to submit his suggestions and comments in writing.

Cody Sedano – Mr. Sedano stated that ASG is not in session so he is not representing anyone at this time. He has met with some community leaders and they discussed how his generation does not participate in voting, etc., as much as they should. This group will be meeting again and reaching out to leaders in Community Colleges, UCs, CSUs and private schools in the

Central Valley. They will be meeting, coming to a general consensus of political topics, and letting representatives at local and state levels know where their generation stands on these issues. They will call it the Millennial Convention.

Morrie Pivovaroff, brother of Helen Shubin – Mr. Pivovaroff spoke to the closed session item that he said involved his sister. He said she had worked at Madera Community College Center and everything was ok. She transferred to Fresno City College as the only white blond female in her area. She says she has been harassed and he gave examples of instances. She has now been recommended for a suspension. He asked the board for their help in this situation.

Raul Perez, CSEA – Mr. Perez introduced himself as labor relations representative. He spoke to the situation regarding Helen Shubin. He stated that they have worked very hard to work with the district to resolve the issue and their proposal was rejected. He said the employee does not need suspension, but does need guidance and leadership.

Morris Pivovaroff, father of Helen Shubin and Morrie Pivovaroff – He said when he got notice of what was going on and read the letter from Dr. Azari, he wrote back to her and she did not respond. He thinks this should be resolved quickly.

Background:

Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations allows districts to charge instructional materials fees for instructional materials of continuing value to students outside of the classroom setting, including, but not limited to, textbooks, tools, equipment, clothing, and those instructional materials necessary for a student's vocational training and employment.

Many of the non-credit courses and various credit courses provide programs appropriate for assessment of an instructional materials fee. These programs, which include automotive, computer aided design and drafting (CADD), criminal justice, and welding projects, require projects as part of their education experience. Because these instructional materials are of continuing value to students and, in most cases, are retained by students, it is appropriate to charge an instructional materials fee. It should be noted the fee cannot exceed the actual cost of the instructional materials provided and cannot be a prerequisite to taking the available class.

In order to provide courses of this nature, the district must rely on students paying the expenses for the value of the personal items; therefore, it is necessary for the Board of Trustees to adopt an instructional materials fee schedule for assessment of the appropriate fee.

Recommendation:

In accordance with Board Policy 6100, administration recommends the Board of Trustees approve the Spring 2017 Schedule of Instructional Materials Fees for Fresno City College, Reedley College, and Clovis Community College.

Fresno City College will use the funding to establish a data warehouse for institutional set standards, facilitate professional development, develop strategic planning, and analyze procedures and processes to provide more effectiveness.

In anticipation of the successful passage of the 2016 Measure C local general obligation bond, RFP# 1516-28 was advertised and released for the purpose of selecting a qualified firm for bond financial advisor services. The primary role of the financial advisor will be to act as our fiduciary, offering advisory services in the area of bond program advice and support. Proposal responses were solicited and received from two firms, as follows: Isom Advisors and KNN Public Finance.

The selection committee reviewed the two responses in regards to qualifications and relevant experience, principals assigned to the program, technical expertise, and pricing. While both of the firms are qualified to perform the services required, administration is recommending KNN Public Finance as the firm to perform bond financial advisory services for the district. KNN Public Finance has significant experience with California community college bond financing, strong analytical capabilities, and the independence and integrity necessary for their fiduciary responsibilities to the district. KNN Public Finance has proposed the lowest price and has committed to a per issuance reduction for concurrent sales.

Fiscal Impact:

Costs incurred will be allocated from the sale of each Measure C local general obligation bond issuance. Each bond issuance would incur a total financial advisor cost of \$50,000, with a not to exceed cost of \$4,000 for related expenses.

The selection committee reviewed the seven responses in regards to qualifications, relevant experience, approach, understanding of the district requirements, and cost basis. Through the use of a stringent and fair evaluation process, committee rankings show certain firms best represented the strengths, structure, and methods that most closely align with district requirements. Based upon the committee's evaluation of responses, the administration is recommending the selection of three firms, Morgan Stanley & Co. LLC, Piper Jaffray & Co., and Stifel, Nicolaus & Company, to serve as part of the underwriting team for the initial bond issuance. These firms each have the California community college knowledge and experience,

significant underwriting capacity, access to available markets, and competitive rates to successfully complete the underwriting services required by the district. A determination will be made by administration, with consultation from our bond financial advisor, as to which firm will lead and/or co-manage the underwriting services necessary for the first issuance of the district's general obligation bond program. The recommended firms have agreed to match the low proposal and perform underwriting services for .2155% of each bond issuance. Underwriting firms for future bond sales beyond this initial issuance will be determined under a new RFP process.

Fiscal Impact:

Costs incurred will be allocated from the sale of the initial Measure C local general obligation bond issuance. By example: a bond issuance of \$100,000,000 would incur a total underwriting cost of \$215,500, inclusive of all expenses. This rate structure is extremely competitive compared to recent GO Bond issuances across the state for California community colleges.

Background:

In 2012, State Center Community College District, through Reedley College and its partnership with Kings Canyon Unified School District (KCUSD), established a Board of Governors (BOG) approved Reedley Middle College High School (RMCHS) on its campus. The RMCHS is a unique collaborative program that results in high school students completing a high school diploma on the college campus while concurrently earning significant college credit. The BOG recognizes the positive impact and unique enhancements of middle college high schools nationwide and refers to these types of collaborations as a “national treasure” that should be supported.

Since 2012, administration has provided the board with several updates on the progress and evolution of the RMCHS, including bringing forward board actions, which were approved in accordance with the institutional commitment and the expectations of the State of California for supporting middle college high school programs. In May 2015, the SCCC Board of Trustees and the KCUSD board approved a licensing agreement through a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) allowing KCUSD to construct temporary and permanent RMCHS facilities on the Reedley College campus. The term of the MOU concludes in August 2018 or at the completion of a permanent RMCHS campus. KCUSD has constructed temporary facilities and is in the design phase, in preparation for construction of the permanent RMCHS facilities. Additionally, verification was given to the SCCC Board in June 2015 that SCCC and KCUSD meet the legal requirements for the middle college high school for both community colleges and K-12.

A Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement outlines the partnership requirements of a 29-year agreement between SCCC and KCUSD relative to the permanent RMCHS facility. The agreement outlines the terms, including the responsibilities of the parties relative to operations, maintenance, and use of the facility. KCUSD, under the terms of this agreement, will operate and maintain the facility as the RMCHS. At the termination of the agreement, the facility will become the property of the district. Furthermore, this will allow KCUSD to request state or grant funding for the permanent RMCHS

facilities through the statewide educational facilities bond measure, should the bond move forward and pass.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees:

- a) authorize the district a Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement (JPA) between the district (on behalf of Reedley College) and Kings Canyon Unified School District; and
- b) authorize the chancellor or vice chancellor of finance and administration to sign the joint exercise of powers agreement on behalf of the district.

**JOINT EXERCISE OF POWERS AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
STATE CENTER COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT
AND
KINGS CANYON UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT**

This Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement (“Agreement”) is made and entered into this _____ day of _____, 2016, by and between the State Center Community College District (“SCCCD”) and the Kings Canyon Unified School District (“KCUSD”) on the terms and conditions which follow:

RECITALS

WHEREAS, in or around May 2015, SCCC and KCUSD entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (“MOU”), attached hereto as Exhibit “A” and incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the MOU summarized a license agreement and other terms and conditions between the parties to cooperatively promote the successful achievement of college credits for high school students attending Reedley Middle College High School program (“RMCHS Program”), to be operated on the SCCC’s Reedley College Campus by KCUSD; and

WHEREAS, the MOU was intended to allow KCUSD to immediately install portable classrooms in order to begin operating the RMCHS Program and to allow KCUSD to plan for the design and installation of permanent facilities for the RMCHS Program; and

WHEREAS, SCCC and KCUSD now desire to enter into this Agreement to set forth the terms and conditions the parties have agreed to in order to allow for the construction of permanent facilities for the long term operation of the RMCHS Program through a ground lease of certain SCCC real property (the “Facility”); and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of SCCC and KCUSD to participate in the joint use project described herein.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

**ARTICLE 1
SUBJECT OF AGREEMENT**

- A. Premises. SCCC, in exchange for the consideration provided in this Agreement, leases to KCUSD the real property located west of the arboretum and northwest of the Landscape Horticulture buildings of the SCCC’s existing Reedley College campus (“Premises”), which is more particularly described in the legal description and schematic diagrams attached as Exhibit “B.”

- B. Facility. Pursuant to the terms of this Agreement and the MOU, KCUSD shall design and construct the Facility for the RMCHS Program, consisting of permanent buildings. Phase One of construction will build a two-story structure that will serve 300 students. The Phase One facilities will include eight (8) classrooms, one (1) technology lab, and appropriate administrative/supporting spaces comprising approximately 19,672 square feet, utility lines and connections, site work, parking, and emergency access on the Premises as set forth herein, consistent with the schematic diagram set forth in Exhibit "B." The Phase Two facilities will construct a two-story structure that will serve an additional 300 students. The phase 2 building will include (8) additional classrooms comprising of approximately 7,680 square feet. Full build-out for Phase One and Two facilities will equate to approximately 27,352 square feet that will serve approximately 600 students.
- C. Permissible Use of SCCCDC Property. The Parties have expressly agreed that the MOU and this Agreement are entered into solely for the purpose of permitting the operation of the RMCHS program on SCCCDC property. Any failure by KCUSD to either (1) continue to operate the RMCHS program consistent with the terms of the original MOU; or (2) substantially change the use of SCCCDC property without the prior written approval of SCCCDC shall constitute a breach of this Agreement and default by KCUSD. In the event of any such breach SCCCDC may terminate this Agreement pursuant to Article VIII below.

ARTICLE II JOINT USE CONTRIBUTIONS

- A. SCCCDC Contribution By Way of Real Estate Lease. SCCCDC hereby contributes a real estate lease, as a ground lease to KCUSD, together with the right of access as specified at the location described in Article I, B. Title to the Premises shall otherwise remain in SCCCDC. The lease term and right of extension is defined as set forth in Article III.
- B. KCUSD Contribution of Facility. KCUSD shall design and construct the Facility at its sole cost and expense. KCUSD shall also construct such external improvements as are necessary or desirable for the operation of the Facility, which may include vehicle parking areas, patio, access, and landscaping (collectively, the "Project"). SCCCDC shall have the opportunity to review and approve the drawings at 50% completion of the drawings and 80% completion of the drawings and provide input on the plans for the Facility and for the external improvements. KCUSD shall not commence construction of the Project without first obtaining final approval of the design from SCCCDC. KCUSD will be responsible for all costs associated to coordinate, design, and construct any site or facilities improvements required by KCUSD, or due to KCUSD, at Reedley College.

ARTICLE III REAL PROPERTY LEASE

- A. Term. The initial term of the lease will begin on August 3, 2016 for a period of twenty-nine (29) years of years expiring on August 3, 2045 unless terminated for default as set forth herein. Upon mutual agreement, SCCCDC and KCUSD may extend the term.

- B. Possession. KCUSD shall be entitled to possession on the first day of the term of this lease and shall yield possession to SCCCD upon termination or expiration of this Agreement. Possession shall mean occupancy of the real property consisting of the ground lease and occupancy of the Facility pursuant to this Agreement.
- C. Consideration for Lease. The lease serves as a ground lease to allow for construction of the Facility and the operation of the RMCHS Program in consideration one dollar (\$1.00) per year.

ARTICLE IV OWNERSHIP OF FACILITY

For the duration of the lease and this Agreement, and any extension thereof, KCUSD shall own the Facility. On termination or expiration of the lease, ownership of and title to the Facility will immediately transfer from KCUSD to SCCCD. KCUSD shall have the right to remove all furniture and equipment, which are not permanently attached fixtures. All other improvements shall be owned by SCCCD. In the event KCUSD is unable or unwilling to remove the furniture and equipment due to lack of funds or any other reason within sixty (60) days of termination or expiration, the ownership of said furniture and equipment shall vest in SCCCD. KCUSD shall execute such documents as necessary to perfect vesting of title to SCCCD.

ARTICLE V PLANNING AND CONSTRUCTION

A. Planning

1. Architect and Other Experts. KCUSD shall be responsible for engaging an architect and other experts as necessary (including, but not limited to, civil engineers, geotechnical engineers, CEQA consultants, and legal counsel) with respect to the planning, designing and ultimate construction, of the Facility. KCUSD has contracted with Integrated Design by SOMAM, Inc. for the first phase for architectural services for the Facility. Future architectural agreements with KCUSD for facilities on the Reedley College campus requires written approval by SCCCD.
2. Design Requirements
 - a. Facility Size. The Facility shall be approximately 27,352 square feet as described above in Article I. B. KCUSD shall also construct such external improvements as are necessary or desirable for the operation of the Facility, which may include vehicle parking areas, patio, access, and landscaping. SCCCD is responsible for all road improvements related to the Facility. The Facility shall comply with Field Act requirements and shall be submitted to and approved by the Division of State Architect (DSA). All fees associated with the design submission and approvals shall be borne by KCUSD.
 - b. Design Consistency. The Facility shall be designed in a manner that is architecturally consistent with the other structures on SCCCD's Reedley College campus site. SCCCD shall have the opportunity to review and

approve the plans at 50% and 80% completion. Construction of the Facility shall not commence prior to SCCCD's final approval of the design. SCCCD may also review and provide input on the plans prior to submittal to DSA for approval. All DSA fees and costs shall be borne by KCUSD.

B. Construction

1. Survey. KCUSD will perform a survey at its cost for purposes of specifically locating the parameters of the Facility on the property. A copy of the survey shall be provided to SCCCD.
2. Contractor Selection and Public Contract Code Compliance. KCUSD shall be responsible for selecting qualified, licensed contractors, subcontractors, construction manager or managers and related consultants necessary to build the Facility, subject to all bidding requirements required by Public Contract Code section 20111 et seq. KCUSD shall conduct a constructability review of the design plans before construction begins.
3. CEQA Compliance. KCUSD shall be responsible for ensuring compliance with all applicable requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and for providing all related documents and approvals to SCCCD.
4. Construction Schedule; Notice. SCCCD shall be given at least thirty (30) days' notice of commencement of construction and a proposed schedule of commencement and completion of construction for SCCCD's review and approval.
5. Temporary Fencing or Similar Barrier. During the construction phase, temporary fencing or a similar barrier shall be erected to insure the safety and security of the Site, and to prevent injury and vandalism.
6. Utilities. KCUSD shall be solely responsible for establishing utility connections, including separate meters, required for construction and operation of the Facility and the RMCHS Program and for all costs of utilities associated therewith. KCUSD shall submit its proposed utility pathways, including interconnections, to SCCCD for review and approval.
7. Interference with SCCCD Activities. Construction and operation of the Facility shall not result in any interference with SCCCD programs or activities.
8. Stop Payment Notices. Defense and payment of claims against the Project, whether stylized as mechanics' liens or stop notices, shall be the responsibility of KCUSD. No such liens shall be allowed to remain on the Premises.
9. Punch List; Warranty Work. KCUSD shall ensure completion of the work in accordance with the plans approved by DSA. KCUSD, or its agents, shall ensure that all punch list items and warranty work are completed in conformance with the plans.

10. Warranties. KCUSD shall secure and enforce warranties for the work from the contractors and subcontractors as appropriate. KCUSD shall not waive any warranty for defect in design or workmanship or waive any statutes of limitation in relation thereto.
11. Acceptance of the Work; Notice of Completion. KCUSD shall not accept the work or authorize the filing of a notice of completion without input from SCCCD.
12. Performance and Payment Bonds. Before construction, KCUSD's contractor shall furnish payment and performance bonds for the construction of the Project, which shall cover 100% faithful performance of and payment of all obligations arising under the construction project and/or guaranteeing the payment in full of all claims for labor performed and materials supplied for the construction. All bonds shall be in a form approved by SCCCD and shall name KCUSD and SCCCD as dual-obligees under the bonds and shall be provided by a corporate surety authorized and admitted to transact business in California.

To the extent, if any, that the contracted amount for the Facility is increased in connection with the construction, KCUSD's contractor (or subcontractors; collectively contractor) shall cause the amount of the bonds to be increased accordingly and shall promptly deliver satisfactory evidence of such increase to KCUSD and to SCCCD. To the extent available, the bonds shall further provide that no change or alteration of the construction contract and related documents, including, without limitation an increase in the contract amount, extensions of time, or modifications of the time, terms, or conditions of payment to KCUSD's contractor will release the surety. If KCUSD's contractor fails to furnish the required bond, KCUSD, or SCCCD, may terminate the construction contract for cause.

Only bonds executed by an admitted Surety insurer as defined in Code of Civil Procedure section 995.120 shall be accepted. The surety insurers must, unless otherwise agreed to by KCUSD and in writing at the time of issuance of the bonds, have a rating not lower than "A-" as rated by A.M. Best Company, Inc. or other independent rating companies. KCUSD and SCCCD reserve the right to approve or reject the surety insurers selected by contractor and to require the KCUSD's contractor to obtain bonds from surety insurers satisfactory to the KCUSD and SCCCD.

ARTICLE VI OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

- A. Maintenance. KCUSD will maintain in good order and condition the Facility throughout the Lease term. All costs and fees incurred with respect to maintenance will be borne by KCUSD.
- B. Utilities. All utility costs, including but not limited to electric, gas, irrigation, water, sewer, storm, cable, phone and internet, which serve the Facility, will be borne by KCUSD.

- C. Janitorial, Landscape, Care and Security. KCUSD, at its sole cost and expense, shall provide all custodial, landscaping and gardening related to the Facility, and shall provide for security, including an alarm and fire system connected, to prevent theft or vandalism, and fire damage to the Facility. All KCUSD authorized personnel providing services, including vendors, shall be adequately screened by KCUSD and shall be supervised by KCUSD staff.
- D. Deferred Maintenance Schedule. KCUSD shall comply with a deferred maintenance schedule, attached hereto as Exhibit "C," which establishes reasonable timeframes for the replacement of certain major components of the Facility. Failure to comply with the deferred maintenance schedule shall constitute a default by KCUSD and be grounds for termination of this Agreement.
- E. Additional Capital Improvements. To the extent, during the Agreement term, any additional capital improvements that must be made, as opposed to ordinary maintenance and repair, such capital improvements shall be contracted for and made at the expense of KCUSD. SCCCDD shall review and approve the installation of all additional capital improvements.
- F. Operations
1. SCCCDD Right to Use Facility. Upon giving reasonable notice to KCUSD, SCCCDD shall have the right to periodically use the Facility at times it is not in use for the RMCHS Program. The parties shall mutually agree on the scheduling of any such use.
 2. Hiring and Screening of KCUSD Staff. KCUSD shall screen all employees, both full and part time, and shall conduct background and criminal checks as required by Education Code section 45125.1 and any other applicable laws or policies.
 3. Hours of Operation of Facility. The hours of operations for KCUSD shall coincide with SCCCDD operational hours. The Facility shall not normally be open on Saturdays, Sundays or some designated holidays. In the case of special events, the hours of operation may be modified on a case-by-case basis as agreed to by KCUSD and SCCCDD. It is the responsibility of KCUSD to inform SCCCDD when hours and days of operation are in conflict. These hours and days of operation may be adjusted from time to time as agreed upon between KCUSD and SCCCDD.
 4. Parking Facilities. Upon request SCCCDD may provide an additional area for the construction of parking at a location to be selected by SCCCDD, but KCUSD shall be solely responsible for paying to construct such an additional parking facility. Alternatively, KCUSD students shall also have the option to purchase a SCCCDD parking permit to park in SCCCDD lots.
 5. SCCCDD's Right to Exclude Staff or Facility User. Notwithstanding the hiring and disciplinary policies of KCUSD's employees or consultants, SCCCDD reserves the right to exclude from the Facility and the Campus any such employee or consultant who engages in disruptive conduct at the Facility or on SCCCDD property, or

whether or not at the Facility or on SCCC property, engages in conduct constituting moral turpitude whether or not convicted of a criminal offense. SCCC shall have the right to exclude any user of the Facility engaging in disruptive conduct or commits vandalism either to the Facility or to SCCC property.

6. Public Relations; Press Releases. Any press releases or public relations related to the Facility (excluding its day-to-day programs and/or operations) shall be mutually agreed upon with SCCC before release or dissemination.
7. Access to Facility and Inspection. SCCC, and its authorized representatives, shall have emergency access to the Facility at all times, and shall be provided one set of master keys upon completion of the Facility. Except in the case of an emergency, KCUSD shall be notified in advance by SCCC representatives, prior to SCCC accessing the Facility for inspections. The purpose for SCCC after-hours access shall be to ensure security and integrity of the Facility and to assure that the Facility is being operated in compliance with this Agreement.
8. No Assignment of Rights or Obligations. For the duration of this Agreement, including any extensions, KCUSD shall have no authority to assign its rights or obligations or to sublet the Facility, any SCCC property, or any buildings or equipment on SCCC property. KCUSD shall be permitted to allow third parties to use the Facility if approved in writing by and only under the supervision, direction and control of KCUSD. SCCC shall be notified at least five business days in advance of the third party use and shall have the option to refuse consent for the use.

ARTICLE VII INSURANCE AND INDEMNITY

A. Liability Insurance Requirements

1. Before the commencement of the work, KCUSD's contractor shall purchase from and maintain, in a company or companies lawfully authorized to do business in California as admitted carriers with a financial rating of at least not lower than A-status as rated in the most recent edition of Best's Insurance Reports, commercial general liability insurance per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage including automobile liability insurance at a limit of no less than \$2,500,000 combined single limit per occurrence as will protect the contractor from claims which may arise out of or result from the contractor's construction activities and for which the contractor may be legally liable, whether such operations are by the contractor, or by the subcontractor, a sub-subcontractor, by anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or by anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable:
 - a. claims for damages because of bodily injury (including emotional distress), sickness, disease, or death of any person other than the

contractor's employees. This coverage shall be provided in a form at least as broad as Insurance Services Office (ISO) Form CG 0001 11188; and

- b. claims for damages arising from personal or advertising injury in a form at least as broad as ISO Form CG 0001 11188; and
- c. claims for damages because of injury or destruction of tangible property, including loss of use resulting there from, arising from work under this Agreement; and
- d. for property damage arising out of the ownership, maintenance, or use of a motor vehicle, all mobile equipment, and vehicles moving under their own power and engaged in the work; and
- e. claims involving blanket contractual liability applicable to the contractor's obligations under this Agreement, including liability assumed by and the indemnity and defense obligations of the contractor including subcontractors; and
- f. claims involving completed operations, independent contractors' coverage, and Broad Form property damage, without any exclusions for collapse, explosion, demolition, underground coverage, and excavating.

If commercial general liability insurance or another insurance form with a general aggregate limit is used, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to the project location (with the ISO CG 2501 or insurer's equivalent endorsement provided to) or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit.

Any deductible or self-insured retention must be declared to and approved by KCUSD and SCCCD. At the option of SCCCD, either the insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retentions as respects SCCCD, its Board of Trustees, members of its Board of Trustees, officers, employees, agents and volunteers; or the contractor shall procure a bond for KCUSD and guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigations, claim administration and defense expenses.

KCUSD shall direct the contractor to require its subcontractors and any sub-subcontractors to take out and maintain similar public liability insurance and property damage insurance in like amounts.

The contractor shall name, on any policy of insurance, SCCCD and KCUSD and KCUSD's architect (if desired by KCUSD) as additional insured. Subcontractors shall name the contractor, SCCCD, KCUSD and the architect (if desired by KCUSD) as additional insured. The Additional Insured Endorsement included on all such insurance policies shall state that coverage is afforded the additional insured with respect to claims arising out of construction activities performed by or on behalf of KCUSD. If the additional insured have other insurance, which is

applicable to the loss, such other insurance shall be excess to any policy of insurance required herein. The amount of the insurer's liability shall not be reduced by the existence of such other insurance.

2. Workers' Compensation Insurance. During the construction of the Project, KCUSD's contractor shall provide workers' compensation insurance for all of the contractor's employees engaged in work on the project and, in case any of the contractor's work is sublet, the contractor shall require the subcontractor to provide workers' compensation insurance for all the subcontractor's employee engaged in the project under the subcontract. Any class of employee or employees not covered by a subcontractor's insurance shall be covered by the contractor's insurance.

In case any class of employees engaged in the project under this Agreement on or at the site of the Project is not protected under the Workers' Compensation laws, the contractor shall provide or cause a subcontractor to provide adequate insurance coverage for the protection of those employees not otherwise protected. The contractor shall file with KCUSD, and KCUSD shall submit Certificates of Insurance as required under this Article and in compliance with Labor Code section 3700.

3. Builder's Risk/"Broad Form" Insurance. KCUSD's contractor, during the progress of the construction and until final acceptance of the construction by KCUSD upon completion of the Facility at the Site, shall maintain Builder's Risk/"All Risk," course-of-construction insurance satisfactory to SCCC and KCUSD issued on a completed value basis on the cost of the work. Coverage is to provide extended coverage and insurance against vandalism, theft, malicious mischief, perils of fire, civil authority, terrorist attack, sonic boom, collapse, flood, wind, lightning, smoke, riot, debris removal (including demolition), and reasonable compensation for the architect's services and expenses required as a result of such insured loss upon the entire project which is the subject of the Agreement, including completed work on the project and the work in progress to the full insurable value thereof. Such insurance shall include SCCC, KCUSD and KCUSD's architect, if desired by KCUSD, as a loss payee, and any other person with an insurable interest designated by KCUSD or SCCC as an additional named insured.

KCUSD's contractor shall submit to KCUSD and for their approval all items deemed to be uninsurable. The risk of the damage to the project due to the perils covered by the Builder's Risk/"Broad Form" Insurance, as well as any other hazard which might result in damage to the construction, is that of the contractor and the surety, and no claims for such loss or damage shall be recognized by KCUSD and nor will such loss or damage excuse the complete and satisfactory performance of the construction by KCUSD's contractor.

4. Fire Insurance. Before the commencement of the project, KCUSD's contractor shall procure, maintain, and cause to be maintained at the contractor's expense, fire insurance on all of the project subject to loss or damage by fire and the entire structure on which the work of this Agreement is to be done to the insurable value

thereof. The amount of fire insurance shall be subject to approval by KCUSD and SCCCD and shall be sufficient to protect the project against loss or damage in full until the project is accepted by KCUSD and SCCCD. Should the work being constructed be damaged by fire or other causes during construction, it shall be replaced in accordance with the requirements of the drawings and specifications without additional expense to KCUSD or SCCCD.

5. Other Insurance. The contractor shall provide all other insurance required to be maintained under applicable laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations.
6. Proof of Insurance. KCUSD's contractor shall not commence construction nor shall it allow any subcontractor to commence construction under this Agreement until all required insurance, certificates, and an Additional Insured Endorsement and Declarations Page have been obtained and delivered in duplicate to KCUSD and for approval by KCUSD and subject to the following requirements:
 - a. Certificates and insurance policies shall include the following clause: "This policy shall not be non-renewed, canceled, or reduced in required limits of liability or amounts of insurance until notice has been mailed to KCUSD and SCCCD. Date of cancellation or reduction may not be less than thirty (30) days after the date of mailing notice."
 - b. Certificates of Insurance shall state in particular those insured, the extent of insurance, location and operation to which the insurance applies, the expiration date, and cancellation and reduction notices.
 - c. Certificates of Insurance shall clearly state that KCUSD, SCCCD and KCUSD's architect, if desired by KCUSD, are named as additional insured by separate endorsements to the contractor's insurance policies under the policy described and that such insurance policies shall be primary to any insurance or self-insurance maintained by KCUSD.
 - d. KCUSD's contractor and its subcontractors shall produce a certified copy of any insurance policy required herein upon written request by KCUSD or SCCCD.

In the event of the failure of any KCUSD contractor to furnish and maintain any insurance required by this Article, KCUSD and KCUSD's contractor shall be in default under this Agreement. Compliance by KCUSD's contractor with the requirement to carry insurance and furnish certificates, policies, Additional Insured Endorsement and Declarations Page evidencing the same shall not relieve KCUSD or KCUSD's contractor from liability assumed under any provision of this Agreement, including, without limitation, the obligation to defend and indemnify.

- B. KCUSD's Insurance After Construction. At all times during the operation of the Facility, KCUSD shall provide, and at no time allow to lapse, the following insurance which shall have an effective date to cover any liability as described below:

1. Liability Insurance. SCCCD and KCUSD shall not be required to maintain liability insurance in addition to current liability insurance maintained by the parties. Nothing herein shall prevent either party from maintaining self-insurance.
2. Property Insurance. KCUSD shall maintain property (hazard and fire, including sprinkler damage) insurance, which shall include the Replacement Cost Endorsement for the rebuilding of the parts of the Facility damaged in a covered loss. The Replacement Cost Endorsement shall include all replacement costs, including any zoning or building code upgrades as required by the local zoning authority, and shall also include building compliance requirements in conformance with Title 24 (Field Act) Standards.
3. Workers' Compensation and Related Employee Insurance. KCUSD shall maintain workers' compensation insurance and other insurance as required by law for its employees. SCCCD shall maintain worker's compensation and other insurance as required by law for its employees.
4. Use of Insurance Proceeds. In the event of a casualty loss, SCCCD and KCUSD shall meet and confer to determine whether the Facility shall be rebuilt to Field Act Standards. If the Facility is not to be replaced, provided that all demolition and removal and restoration of the site is completed by KCUSD, KCUSD shall be entitled to the insurance proceeds for the loss. If KCUSD declines or fails to restore the Premises to its original condition, SCCCD shall be entitled, and KCUSD hereby agrees, to direct that any insurance proceeds be released to SCCCD in order to engage independent contractors to remove debris and restore the site to its original condition before any insurance proceeds are released to KCUSD.

C. Indemnity

1. Indemnity Arising From Construction of the KCUSD Facility. KCUSD shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless SCCCD, its Board of Trustees, its officers, employees, agents, and volunteers from and against all claims, damages, losses, expenses, permit fees, inspection fees, costs of compliance with environmental laws and regulations, costs of compliance with zoning laws and regulations, costs of compliance with building codes and regulations, any penalties assessed, and all other costs of construction, including reasonable attorney fees and costs, arising out of or related to the construction of the KCUSD Facility.
2. Indemnity Arising From KCUSD Activity or Operation of Facility. KCUSD shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless SCCCD, its Board of Trustees, its officers, employees, agents, and volunteers from and against all claims, damages, losses, expenses, including reasonable attorney fees and costs, arising out of (1) KCUSD's use of the Facility, the site or any portion of SCCCD property, (2) the use of the building or equipment constructed or installed and located on the Site, the Premises or any portion of SCCCD property in violation of the terms of this Agreement, or (3) any negligent act or omission of KCUSD, its employees, agents, volunteers, or anyone for whose acts KCUSD may be liable in connection with the use of the

Facility. This duty to defend, indemnify and hold harmless shall include any liability arising out of the use, operation, supervision, and/or maintenance of (1) the Facility and any equipment thereon, (2) any KCUSD equipment used on the Facility or any other portion of SCCCDD property, (3) any SCCCDD equipment used by KCUSD on the Facility or any other portion of SCCCDD property, and (4) any SCCCDD building used by KCUSD or used in KCUSD activities if permitted by SCCCDD.

ARTICLE VIII DEFAULT AND TERMINATION

A. Default

1. In the event KCUSD breaches any provision of the Agreement it shall be in default. In the event of default, KCUSD shall be given a reasonable cure period, not to exceed sixty (60) calendar days unless extended in writing by SCCCDD, to cure the default after written notice is given to KCUSD. In the event such violation requires more than sixty (60) days to cure, under a reasonable cure period shall be extended provided KCUSD is in good faith continuing the process to cure.
2. In the event SCCCDD breaches any provision of the Agreement it shall be in default. In the event of default, SCCCDD shall be given a reasonable cure period, not to exceed sixty (60) calendar days unless extended in writing by KCUSD, to cure the default after written notice is given to SCCCDD. In the event such violation requires more than 60 days to cure, under a reasonable cure period shall be extended provided SCCCDD is in good faith continuing the process to cure.

B. Termination

1. Failure to cure the default shall render KCUSD in substantial breach of its obligations and shall entitle SCCCDD to exercise any of its remedies in equity or at law including immediate termination of the Agreement and the Lease.
2. Failure to cure the default shall render SCCCDD in substantial breach of its obligations and shall entitle KCUSD to exercise any of its remedies in equity or at law including immediate termination of the Agreement and the Lease.

C. Termination Without Cure Period. There shall be no cure period and the contract shall be terminated immediately on the following event or events:

1. Assignment of Assets for the Benefit of Creditors. If KCUSD assigns all or substantially all of its assets for the benefit of creditors, this Agreement shall be immediately terminated. If SCCCDD assigns all or substantially all of its assets for the benefit of creditors, this Agreement shall be immediately terminated.
2. Assignment of Interest in Agreement or Lease. If KCUSD or SCCCDD assigns any of its rights, duties or obligations under the Agreement or Lease, this Agreement shall be immediately terminated.

3. Filing a Petition of Bankruptcy. A voluntary, or involuntary, filing for bankruptcy by KCUSD shall be cause for immediate termination of the Agreement without notice or further action by SCCCD. A voluntary, or involuntary, filing for bankruptcy by SCCCD shall be cause for immediate termination of the Agreement without notice or further action by KCUSD.
 4. Abandonment of Facility. If KCUSD, for any reason, abandons the Facility, the Agreement shall be terminated. If SCCCD, for any reason, abandons the Facility, the Agreement shall be terminated.
 5. Termination by Expiration of Lease. If not earlier terminated for cause, this Agreement shall terminate upon the expiration of the Lease granted herein or any extension thereof. The Lease granted herein shall be deemed a Lease coupled with an interest. The interest is the Facility owned by KCUSD during the term of the Lease or any extension thereof.
- D. Termination of Lease. Upon termination of the Lease, this Agreement shall terminate and title to the Facility, less reasonable wear and tear, shall vest in SCCCD.

ARTICLE IX TAXES, ASSESSMENTS, AND ENCUMBRANCES

- A. Other Fees. Any fees, whether or not characterized as assessments, including any entitlement or processing fees related to the construction of the Facility whether paid to local, county or state government related to the Facility shall be the responsibility of KCUSD.
- B. Encumbrances. The Facility is on tax-exempt property. KCUSD shall not seek to encumber or otherwise place a lien on the Premises as security for a monetary encumbrance or for the performance of a KCUSD obligation.

ARTICLE X DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- A. Mediation. The parties shall attempt informal, and if so agreed, formal mediation regarding any dispute arising out of this Agreement.
- B. Arbitration. The parties shall endeavor to arbitrate any matters, which cannot be mediated. If the parties desire to arbitrate, they shall mutually agree to arbitrate and they shall further agree as to whether the arbitration shall be binding or non-binding. If the parties are unable to agree to an arbitration service, the parties shall submit any dispute to JAMS.

ARTICLE XI MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- A. Captions. The captions in this Agreement are inserted only as a matter of convenience and for reference and in no way define the scope or the extent of this Agreement or the construction of any provision.

- B. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument. A facsimile or copy shall be as valid as an original.
- C. Entire Agreement; Exhibits. This Agreement, including all exhibits, along with the Real Estate Lease, constitutes the entire agreement and understanding between the parties. There are no oral understandings, terms, or conditions, and neither party has relied upon any representation, express or implied, not contained in this Agreement and the Real Estate Lease. All prior understandings, terms or conditions, including any memorandums of understanding (MOU's) are modified by this Agreement and the Real Estate Lease.
- D. Interpretation. This Agreement shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of California. This Agreement shall be construed as a whole, according to its fair meaning, and not strictly for or against any party. The rule of construction that the contract is to be strictly interpreted against the drafters shall not apply. Each party herein shall be construed as co-drafters.
- E. Other Documents. The parties agree to cooperate fully in carrying out the terms and conditions of this Agreement, including the execution of such other documents that may be necessary to carry out the purpose and intent of this Agreement.
- F. Modification of Agreement. This Agreement may only be modified in writing duly executed and ratified by the parties.
- G. Successors and Assigns. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the successors and assigns of the parties. Neither KCUSD nor SCCCD shall not assign any rights, duties or obligations, including its Lease, under this Agreement. Breach of this provision shall constitute a default and shall be grounds for an immediate termination.
- H. Severability. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be void, voidable, or unenforceable, the remaining portions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This memorandum of understanding (MOU) summarizes agreements between Kings Canyon Unified School District and State Center Community College District (and its component, Reedley College) to cooperatively promote the successful achievement of college credits for high school students attending Reedley Middle College High School. (CA Ed code. 11300). We are entering into this agreement to better serve students and to create a partnership of mutual benefit to institutions in both sectors. It is expected that this effort will increase student commitment to educational achievement including completion of high school graduation requirements and development of an educational plan extending beyond the high school diploma. This MOU will also increase public awareness of the benefits of a partnership between high schools and local colleges. The following understandings will guide this effort, until modified or amended.

1. Purpose and Goals Kings Canyon Unified School District (KCUSD) and Reedley College (RC) will cooperate to offer challenging college coursework for students who wish to remain in the high school environment but are academically prepared for college-level work. This partnership will result in broader educational options for students, attending Reedley Middle College High School (RMCHS).

Specifically, the goals of this partnership are for students to:

- Earn college credit while satisfying high school requirements;
- Continue involvement in high school extracurricular activities;
- Save travel transportation costs and the cost of purchasing books;
- Develop a plan to go on to college after high school.

Reedley Middle College High School will also support and encourage increased high school and college faculty curricular collaboration.

2. Recruitment and Admissions

- A. Recruitment of qualified students will be the responsibility of KCUSD/RMCHS Principal, Learning Director or KCUSD Designee and RC Project Coordinator.
- B. Students are to submit a RMCHS application, and must meet course prerequisites established by KCUSD and RC.
- C. Interviews will be conducted for students who meet established criteria, and students will be notified in a timely manner.
- D. Students accepted into RMCHS will complete a SCCC Application for Admission, (CCC Apply), Reedley College Dual Enrollment application and will be required, as a

condition of admission, to agree that their student records will be shared between and available to each institution. Applications for the new school year must be completed and submitted by the end of the semester prior to the new school year.

1. Costs

- A. This program uses a self-supporting contract structure.
 - 1. Kings Canyon Unified School District will retain the state subsidy for each student. Necessary instructional support and high school teacher salaries will be the responsibility of KCUSD.
 - 2. Reedley College will consider these students as eligible for state support through the College's reporting process, in college level courses. The college instructional support and faculty salaries will be the responsibility of SCCC
- B. RMCHS student college fees will be waived until graduation from RMCHS. Students may not take more than the equivalent of eleven college units per semester, as indicated per California Ed Code 76001 (d).
- C. RMCHS will provide the textbook(s) and other required instructional materials for college courses with no charge to the student. Students will be responsible to pay textbook costs in courses they take in addition, to scheduled pathway recommendations.
- D. Courses which fail to meet a minimum enrollment of 15 will be cancelled.

4. Program Roles & Responsibilities

- A. Reedley Middle College High School will provide all necessary support documents to facilitate the curriculum overviews, textbook selection and high teacher selection processes.
- B. Reedley College will provide all necessary support documents to facilitate the curriculum development and implementation of classroom instruction, textbook selection and faculty selection processes.

5. Conduct & Grievance Policies

- A. Students participating in Reedley Middle College High School program shall comply with the conduct standards of Kings Canyon Unified School District and Reedley College. Complaints regarding instruction will be handled in accordance with KCUSD and RC, per designated class.
- B. Grade grievances involving the final course grade will be as follows: A.) High school courses will be addressed by high school administration and B.) College courses will be addressed by college faculty and/or division dean, prior to posting.

6. Program Support

- A. Students who have satisfied the prerequisites for a RMCHS class are required to take a placement exam (Accuplacer) to determine college readiness. The test is offered at Reedley College, by appointment. Some RMCHS classes require college-level placement in reading, English and math.

- B. Students register for the course by completing a SCCCDC Registration form and Reedley College Dual Enrollment application and, and supporting documentation. All must documents must be submitted in spring for fall courses, and November for spring courses.
- C. The completed registration packets for courses are forwarded to the Reedley College Admissions and Records office at Reedley College.
- D. Reedley College Admissions and Records will provide RMCHS staff a printed registration form for students.
- E. Reedley College Admissions and Records will enter the admission and registration information in the RC student management system (Datatel).
- F. Reedley College Admissions and Records will provide RC instructors a class roster for the term in which they are serving.
- G. At the end of the semester high school grades will be reported to the district by the instructor through Kings Canyon Unified School District grading process (Power School). Reedley College instructors will post grades within Power School or Web Advisor.

7. Term and Termination

- A. The term of this MOU shall be for three academic years, beginning August, 2013. At the end of this term, the Memorandum of Understanding will be subject for renewal and changes to accommodate growth and changes of the program, if mutually agreed upon by the parties in writing.
- B. Amendments to this agreement must be in writing and approved by the designated representative of each institution.
- C. Either party may terminate this agreement for cause by giving written notice to the designated representative at least 60 days prior to the commencement of a new academic term.
- D. This agreement can be terminated at any time by mutual written agreement.

LICENSE AGREEMENT – PORTABLE CLASSROOMS

This License Agreement is entered into by and between Reedley College (RC) and Kings Canyon Unified School District (KCUSD). State Center Community College District (SCCCD), on behalf of Reedley College campus is the owner of the property. KCUSD desires to expand their capacity of classes for an additional four (4) year cohort of the RMCHS known as the Paramount Agriculture Career Academy (Academy), beginning with a freshman class in August, 2015, a sophomore class in August, 2016, and a junior class in August, 2017. KCUSD desires the right to place additional portable classrooms upon the SCCCDC, Reedley College campus property to accommodate this cohort. KCUSD will place the portable classrooms on the RC campus in two (2) phases, as noted below. SCCCDC desires to grant a non-exclusive license for access to, from, on, over, and through the RC campus property for the purpose of construction, installation, and operation of these additional portable classrooms for the Reedley Middle College High School program described in this MOU. In exchange for this license, KCUSD shall convey all its right,

title, and interests in the portable classroom in Phase 1 to State Center Community College District (SCCCD) upon completion of the phase 1 of project. SCCC will then retain ownership for the life of the portable. RC also desires to grant to KCUSD a license in consideration of the express promise of KCUSD to convey all its right, title, and interests in the portable classroom in Phase 2 to State Center Community College District (SCCCD) should this portable classroom ever be vacated by RMCHS.

2. License - Phase 1

- A. KCUSD shall have the right to install a portable classroom on the RC campus that provides space for an RC class equal to the existing RC classroom spaces being provided for the Academy freshman class in August, 2015, as described and depicted in the Site Map/Diagram attached as Exhibit "A."
- B. KCUSD shall construct and install infrastructure consistent with existing classroom spaces being provided for the RMCHS
 - a. 24' x 40' Portable single classroom for use in August, 2015
- C. SCCC, RC shall provide sites for new portable classroom and locations of existing infrastructure as described in Exhibit "A."
- D. KCUSD selection of architects shall be subject to approval by SCCC
- E. SCCC shall be given the opportunity to review and approve construction drawings and specifications prior to DSA submittal, RC shall be included in all construction meetings and any discussions on proposed change orders during the life of the project
- F. SCCC, RC shall provide classroom space on the campus sufficient for the Academy class
 - a. RC classroom POR5 in August, 2015
- G. SCCC, RC shall maintain all of the portables occupied by the RMCHS upon completion and acceptance of all construction/installation work to be performed by KCUSD.

3. License – Phase 2

- A. KCUSD shall have the right to install portable classrooms on the RC campus that will provide classroom spaces for a sophomore class in August, 2016, and a junior class in August, 2017 for the Academy as described and depicted in the Site Map/Diagram attached as Exhibit "A."
- B. KCUSD shall provide infrastructure for portable classroom space for two classrooms
 - a. 36' x 40' Portable double classroom for use in August, 2016
- C. KCUSD shall upgrade existing adjacent restrooms to ADA specifications or provide ADA accessible portable restrooms, as approved by DSA
- D. SCCC, RC shall provide site for two classroom portable at the proposed site for the permanent RMCHS location previously identified by RC as described in Exhibit "A."
- E. SCCC, RC shall be given the opportunity to review and approve construction drawings and specifications prior to DSA submittal; which will include path of travel and ADA requirements
- F. KCUSD selection of architects shall be subject to approval by SCCC
- G. SCCC and RC shall be included in all construction meetings and any discussions on proposed change orders during the life of the project

- H. SCCCDC, RC shall maintain all of the portables occupied by the RMCHS upon completion and acceptance of all construction/installation work to be performed by KCUSD.

4. Costs

- A. KCUSD shall be responsible for all costs associated with the construction and installation of the new portable classrooms to be placed on the Reedley College campus, including but not limited to all design costs, purchase of portables, approval by the Department of State Architect (DSA), all site work (including landscaping, paths of travel, ADA requirements, power and data, infrastructure tie ins), inspection and testing
- B. KCUSD, at its sole costs an expense shall ensure its construction, installation, and operations on the RC property comply with all applicable governmental laws, rules, statutes and regulations, relating to such activities. This obligation includes, but is not limited to, ensuring that any construction contractors hired by KCUSD comply with all applicable public works construction requirements such as payment of prevailing wage, provision of payment and performance bonds, etc.

5. Term

- A. KCUSD shall complete installation of portable classrooms on or before RC classes begin in August, 2015 and simultaneously in August, 2016
- B. KCUSD will provide alternate classroom space for the Academy should installation of the portable classrooms not be completed in ample time for RC classes to begin in August, 2015 and simultaneously in August, 2016
- C. The term of the license agreement – portable classrooms shall be for three (3) years or until the completion of the permanent RCMHS campus in August, 2018

LICENSE AGREEMENT – RMCHS PERMANENT FACILITY

This License Agreement is entered into by and between Reedley College (RC) and Kings Canyon Unified School District (KCUSD). State Center Community College District (SCCCD), on behalf of Reedley College campus is the owner of the property. KCUSD desires to establish a permanent facility for the Reedley Middle College High School (RMCHS) by August, 2018. KCUSD desires the right to place the permanent building(s) upon the SCCCDC, Reedley College campus property to accommodate approximately 400-600 students identified in a Needs Assessment. RC desires to grant to KCUSD a non-exclusive license for access to, from, on, over, and through the RC campus property for the purpose of construction, installation, and operation of the permanent building(s) for the Reedley Middle College High School program described in this MOU. In exchange for this license, KCUSD shall convey all its right, title, and interests in the permanent buildings to State Center Community College District (SCCCDC) in the event that the buildings are ever vacated by RMCHS. SCCCDC will retain ownership for the life of the permanent structure, should this event occur.

1. License

- A. KCUSD shall have the right to design and construct permanent building(s) on the RC campus that provide adequate space for existing and expanded student growth as identified in the Needs Assessment, with the prior written approval of SCCCDC.

- B. KCUSD shall have the right to include office space, food services, and restroom facilities within the permanent building construction
- C. KCUSD shall have the right to include a parking lot sufficient to staff and student needs
- D. SCCCDC, RC shall provide site for permanent RMCHS permanent structures as described and depicted in the Site Map/Diagram attached as Exhibit "A."
- E. SCCCDC shall be given the opportunity to review and approve construction drawings and specifications prior to DSA submittal
- F. KCUSD selection of architects shall be subject to approval by SCCCDC
- G. SCCCDC and RC shall be included in all construction meetings and any discussions on proposed change orders during the life of the project
- H. SCCCDC shall be responsible for issues related to traffic flow

2. Costs

- A. KCUSD Shall be responsible for all costs associated with the design and construction of the permanent building(s) to be placed on the Reedley College campus, including but not limited to all design costs, purchase of portables, approval by the Department of State Architect (DSA), all site work (including landscaping, paths of travel, ADA requirements, power and data, infrastructure tie ins), inspection and testing
- B. KCUSD shall be responsible for all maintenance costs to support the ongoing needs of the permanent building(s)
- C. KCUSD shall be responsible for all custodial costs to support the ongoing needs of the staff and students utilizing the permanent building(s)
- D. KCUSD shall be responsible for all operating costs necessary to support the permanent building(s)
- E. KCUSD shall be responsible for all costs associated with the construction of a parking lot ample to meet the needs of all RMCHS staff and students
- F. KCUSD, at its sole costs an expense shall ensure its construction, installation, and operations on the SCCCDC, RC property comply with all applicable governmental laws, rules, statutes and regulations, relating to such activities. This obligation includes, but is not limited to, ensuring that any construction contractors hired by KCUSD comply with all applicable public works construction requirements such as payment of prevailing wage, provision of payment and performance bonds, etc.

3. Term

- A. KCUSD shall complete construction of the permanent building(s) on or before RC classes begin in August, 2018
- B. KCUSD will provide alternate classroom space for the fourth Senior class of the Academy should the construction of the permanent building(s) not be completed in ample time for RC classes to begin in August, 2018

Insurance and Liability

1. Insurance: SCCCDC and KCUSD agree to provide and maintain, at their own expense, a program of insurance covering the activities and operations of their respective officers, agents and employees hereunder. Such programs of insurance shall include, but are not

limited to, comprehensive general liability and professional liability. The general liability insurance shall have a minimum coverage of \$1,000,000; the occurrence and \$3,000,000 in the aggregate. Upon written request, either party shall provide the other with a certificate evidencing such coverage.

2. Indemnity: SCCC and KCUSD shall save, hold each other harmless and defend each other against any and all liability claims, costs, of whatever kind and nature for damage, injury to or death of any person or persons, including without limitation, personal injury or death of a student admitted to or studying under the terms of this memorandum of Understanding, resulting in whole or part for the negligent acts or omissions of their respective employees, agents or representatives.

General Provisions

1. "As Is" Condition. KCUSD accepts the licenses contained herein subject to the "As Is," "Where Is" condition of the RC property and subject to any condition that may exist, without any representation or warranty by the SCCC. KCUSD acknowledges and agrees that the SCCC makes no representations or warranties, express or implied, as to the RC property except as specifically set forth in this agreement. KCUSD has conducted all inspections of the RC property to its full and complete satisfaction and acknowledges that it will be using the RC property with full knowledge of any and all conditions of the RC property. KCUSD hereby assumes the risk that certain conditions may exist on the RC property and hereby releases the District of and from any and all claims, actions, demands, rights, damages, costs or expenses that might arise out of or in connection with any such condition of the RC property.
2. Title to RC property. The Parties agree that fee title to the RC property shall at all times remain fully vested in the SCCC. KCUSD shall neither file, record, nor permit the recording or filing of, any lien, including any mechanics or other lien(s), claim(s) or encumbrance(s) of any nature with respect to the licenses set forth herein or any portion of the RC property, nor shall KCUSD use or permit to be used any portion of the RC property, or such licenses, to be used as security for any transaction of any kind. KCUSD shall immediately remove any lien(s), claim(s) or encumbrance(s) of any kind, including any security obligation of any nature, which KCUSD causes or permits to be filed or recorded against any portion of the RC property. KCUSD shall be liable to the SCCC for all costs, damages, reasonable attorneys' fees, and any amounts expended in defending any proceedings or in the payment of any of said liens or claims or any judgment obtained therefor pursuant to the indemnification provisions of this agreement.
3. These agreements solely sets forth the contractual rights of the parties and does not create any other rights of action as a result of this agreement. Additionally, each party agrees that it shall be responsible for the negligence of its own officers, officials, employees and agents, and that neither party shall be considered the other's agent. This agreement is for the time period specified above and is renewable, upon mutual agreement. This agreement shall not create any rights in any third parties, specifically any students participating in the program.

The only parties to this agreement are Kings Canyon Unified School District on behalf of Reedley Middle College High School and Reedley College.



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

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


SITE PLAN

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
FLOOR PLAN - 1st FLOOR

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FLOOR PLAN - 2nd FLOOR

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


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
