- **1.** The Educational Master Plan is being worked on to determine the Student Growth.
- **2.** The District has the authority to update their 5-year plan and thereby determine what their highest priority need is.
- **3.** The number one priority from students and faculty is parking, that has not changed in the time from the 2012 District Wide Facility Master Plan.
- **4.** There was a question about entering the campus on College Ave off Blackstone south of the Child Development Center. Is it a feasible entry point?
- 5. Southern Blackstone Smart Mobility project is an approved local grant project.
- **6.** Enrollment projects are in process that consultants work will project enrollment to 2030. This will help with determining the need based on growth.
- 7. There was a question asking whether the Master Plan will update the list of projects that were completed based on the 2012 Master Plan. That will help show the progress that has been made in the past with bond money.

POTENTIAL UPDATES

- ATHLETICS
 - a. In discussions with athletics, the department wants, Tennis, 50 Meter pool and softball near the Gym and Locker rooms.

• CUSTODIAL AND WAREHOUSE

- a. Custodial space and warehouse needs will need to be determined for the FCC main and support spaces.
- b. It was thought they would need a large warehouse, if relocated to the Police Academy.

• TRAFFIC AND PARKING

- a. The possible effects should be considered for the traffic on the entry road near the Child Development Center. There is a lot of student's pedestrians to be considered. Safety of children being dropped off is also a concern.
- b. There are so many students coming from parking on the East Side to campus. They cross campus roads and at times stop traffic.

• CAFETERIA FOOD SERVICE

a. Cafeteria food service program will evolve. Is the Cafeteria large enough for the current student population?

• STUDENT SERVICES

- a. There was a concern that the size of the student services. Will it be big enough?
- b. There are more programs that would go into that building.
