1. FUSD Design Science Program

- Dr. Goldsmith presented the group with an update regarding community input on the design and on FUSD bringing their program to the project.
- Christine Miktarian shared that FUSD will be bringing \$5m to the project and that the college
 would have use of the double classrooms "after hours". Jonathan stated that the square footage
 and their costs will be accounted for in the Final Detailed Program document.
- Jonathan presented the previous plan and the revised three floors options integrating FUSD
 Design Science program into the building and relocating the Faculty Offices (see attached). It was
 noted that the Faculty's work with RFD had not been lost or changed and that all of the net
 square footage and special relationships remained the same.
- The group discussed the plans and had the following comments:
 - o The Welcome Center should have coffee and be a lively open space for students.
 - o The outside covered area should accommodate food trucks and other similar options.
 - The Tech Office should be centrally located so that the Tech can see down both Prep Halls.
 - There need to be 20 offices for Biology. Lionakis will explore how both floors might achieve this.
 - There was some concern that some Chemistry space in the Prep Room had been lost when the building was "bent" 90 degrees. Jonathan stated it was probably just a coloring error but will confirm.
 - Staff Restrooms were requested, which are shown in the plans in the office / workroom area.
- The schedule was discussed. Jonathan shared that a schedule had just been sent showing submitting to DSA in early 2020, construction taking all of 2021 and 2022 to be ready to open in 2023.
