### **NOTES**

The following results are a summary of a Community Meeting on November 8, 2018, where attendees provided feedback on what they would like to see in their new campus. The Design Team walked the anticipated program and addressed public questions. Breakout groups were established, consisting of 3-6 people, mixed between community members, college staff, K-12 staff, and government officials.

Groups were asked to list goals of the campus from the perspective of Students, Community Business Owners, and District Officials. Numbers after comments indicate multiple instances of this idea or concern.

## Audience questions and discussion of preliminary program summary:

- 1) Will the campus include a Joint-Use Library? The current County Library is holding on an expansion pending on scope of new campus.
  - a. RESPONSE: These are the current projections for this program. We will discuss this more in detail with the District.
- 2) This program is stated as Phase 1, will there be additional Phases?
  - a. RESPONSE: There will potentially be additional Phases pending the needs of the community and campus and the approval of future Bonds.
- 3) Will the Labs also be used as teaching spaces?
  - a. RESPONSE: Possibly. We are looking at the potential flexibility of the spaces and the needs of the campus.
- 4) Are there enough teaching spaces?
  - a. RESPONSE: We are confirming with current class schedules and future programs the District might add.
- 5) Will the rooms accommodate Distance Learning (DL)?
  - a. RESPONSE: The program is intending many of the rooms will accommodate Distance Learning.
- 6) Will the entire 32,000 square feet of building within the potential program be included within Phase 1?
  - a. RESPONSE: Yes.
- 7) Will there be one or multiple buildings? Will they be under one roof?
  - a. RESPONSE: This is still to be determined based on the feedback we receive from the District, the Public, and the project controls of budget, schedule, and goals.
- 8) When will it be completed? Will any of the existing portables be used for this new campus?
  - a. RESPONSE: The anticipated completion will be Fall 2021, but we can't confirm this since we are still early in the project. The portables will not be used.
- 9) We have a strong Fitness Community in our area. Will there be any fitness accommodations or running path/track?
  - a. RESPONSE: This is a possibility due to the size of the site, however it is still to be determined based on feedback of the District and Public, taking in account budget, schedule and project goals.
- 10) Can someone obtain a 4-year degree at this campus?
  - a. RESPONSE: Currently there is no 4-year degree offerings, however, SCCCD provides a pathway for a 4-year degree with their educational partners.
- 11) Will there be any travel accommodations to other cities (i.e. Visalia Bus to Fresno State)?
  - a. RESPONSE: We are still figuring out those needs and capabilities with SCCCD.
- 12) Will There be any Vocational Educational facilities?

- a. RESPONSE: SCCCD is looking at partnerships with other educational facilities to ensure that all partners are maximizing their current facilities, and what additional facilities the students might need.
- 13) I don't see anything for Outdoor programming. Will this be considered?
  - a. RESPONSE: Yes, this programming will take place when we start looking at the site and the needs of the District, in addition taking account of budget, schedule, and project goals.
- 14) Will the new campus fit within the landscape of Oakhurst?
  - a. RESPONSE: Yes, as architects, we want to let the campus be a result of the landscape.
- 15) Will this be a 1-story or 2-story building?
  - a. RESPONSE: This has not been determined yet, pending the outcome of the final program needs of the District and Students, in addition taking account of budget, schedule, and project goals.
