NOTES

The following results are a summary of a Community Meeting on February 28, where attendees provided feedback on how the campus should appear, both exterior and interior. The Design Team updated the public with the anticipated program, space adjacencies, Site layout considerations, and addressed public questions. The Design Team conducted a Visual Listening Exercise and asked the public to provide commentary on examples of design elements for how they want the campus to feel. The Public group consisted of community members, college staff, K-12 staff, and government officials.

Public questions and discussion of program, adjacencies, and site considerations:

- 1) How many students will this campus provide for?
 - a. RESPONSE: 500 to 600 students initially, 1,200 students for full campus build-out.
- 2) Does the District see the spaces as adequate?
 - a. RESPONSE: Yes
- 3) Are the Rooms to big, or are there too many?
 - a. RESPONSE: Per our original programming meetings, yes, however, we will re-visit with the District to confirm our information.
- 4) Will there be Gender Neutral restrooms?
 - a. RESPONSE: Yes
- 5) What is the Project Budget and has a traffic study been completed?
 - a. RESPONSE: The Project Budget is \$35 million. Russ Shaw has completed a Traffic Study.
- 6) Will the State of California be matching any funding?
 - a. RESPONSE: No. This project is based on a Local Bond.
- 7) Will there be any Vocational training or education?
 - a. RESPONSE: Not at this site. The District is trying to work with the other local schools to share facilities.
- 8) Will there be operable windows?
 - a. RESPONSE: We hope so, pending the public's feedback.
- 9) Will there be Solar?
 - a. RESPONSE: Possibly, pending on the alternate strategies conducted by the District.

- 10) The Site is located in an area called "Windy Gap" with major winds coming from the Northwest. Will we be taking advantage of these winds?
 - a. RESPONSE: We would like to.
- 11) I have concerns about ice and snow. How will this be addressed?
 - a. RESPONSE: We understand this is a safety and maintenance concern. We will work with the District to provide the best design possible.
- 12) Where are we at with the Environmental Impact Report?
 - a. RESPONSE: Scott O'Dell has already started the process.
- 13) Will the Masterplan provide for dormitory housing?
 - a. RESPONSE: This depends on the future needs of the Public and District.
- 14) How is the District promoting and attracting students?
 - a. RESPONSE: We plan on having a nice campus and broader programs that fit what the Public is asking for.
