Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee

The Measure C & E Citizen's Bond Oversight Committee is made up of nine members. The criteria for selection are established by Prop 39 and includes specific representation. The role of the committee is to oversee expenditures and let the public know if Measure C & E money is being spent as promised in the ballot measure. Among other responsibilities, the committee will review expenditures to ensure that no bond proceeds are used for instructor or administrative salaries or other operating expenses unrelated to the bond. The Citizen's Oversight Committee held a meeting on Thursday, June 22, 2017 at 5:30 p.m. and the following updates were provided and actions taken:

Fresno City College Campus Committee is working with the PMSM architect firm for planning work on projects on and off the FCC campus, uncluding:

- Police and fire academies
- The West Fresno campus
- Parking expansion
- Career & Technology Center improvements
- A new Math/Science building.

With the number of projects at the college, the goal is to develop a plan that will determine which projects will take place when and where. This process is proceeding as scheduled. Currently, it requires feedback from the campus when they return for the fall semester. The goal is to bring a community driven Fresno City College draft planning recommendation to the Board of Trustees in October.

West Fresno



Fresno City College hosted its first community meeting to gather input on the new West Fresno campus. The West Fresno Community Conversation took place on June 28, 2017 at Rutherford B. Gaston Middle School. The event was very well attended with more than 175 people participating. The community provided input on the types of classes, services and programs they want to see at the West Fresno campus. Fresno City College is working with local community groups to reach out to more West Fresno residents for upcoming community meetings. Centro La Familia, Blong Xiong and Fresno EOC Street Saints will each host three community outreach events. After the community input period is concluded, the FCC Planning committee will identify programs for West Fresno and the administration is expected to come back to the Board in the fall with a draft campus plan.

City College | Reedley College | Clovis Community College | Madera and Oakhurst Community College Centers Cultivating Lives Through Education



Currently, Oakhurst Community College Center is comprised of portable buildings. The District will use Measure C funds to build a permanent facility in Oakhurst to better serve the mountain communities. The SCCCD Board approved Odell Planning and Research of Oakhurst to serve as California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) consultant on this project.

Through the process of requesting potential properties at Oakhurst, eleven sites were evaluated by district administration for site expansion. Of the eleven properties, four areas have been identified as potential sites for the Oakhurst campus. The sites were evaluated based on input from student and community surveys and community workshop feedback. The input received was the basis for the site selection criteria, which resulted in an emphasis placed on access*, food services, and emergency services. Administration and consultant recommendations resulted in the need to also include logistical considerations, such as utility connections, terrain, governmental planning, etc. into the site evaluation criteria.

The next phase of this process will provide a more in-depth evaluation of the four properties that will include cost and the review of property studies, such as environmental, biological, traffic, archeological, drainage, etc.

Scott O'Dell and his staff at Odell Planning and Research are currently reviewing the sites and the administration will make a recommendation to the Board in the fall.

*The area of "access" includes access to the site using both private and public transportation; and, access to the site and on the site, which includes the evaluation of the existing terrain, slope changes, trees, and the ease (or difficulties) of grading the site for ADA access.



SCCCD is seeking to maximize the impact of Measure C and optimize the available budget for the Clovis Community College Applied Technology Facilities through a request for additional state funding. Proposition 51, the California Public School Facility Bonds Initiative was approved in the November 2016 election and provides \$9 billion in bonds to improve and construct school facilities, which includes \$2 billion for acquiring, constructing, renovating, and equipping community college facilities.

If state funding is approved for allocation, the Clovis Project will be constructed in three phases. The District submitted Phase 1 and it has been approved by the state chancellor's office to be a viable and competitive project with a 50% state match.

However, because we have been growing, we are now eligible for a second state funded project, which has been submitted as Phase 2. Because Phase 2 is such a competitive project, there is a possibility that it will receive 60% state funding. In the event this occurs, we would be able to use the remaining funds for Phase 3 of the construction. It is important to note that there is no guarantee of receiving state funding.

Each year, the California Community College Chancellor's Office requires every district to submit a Five-Year Construction Plan that lists all its proposed capital construction projects, which includes both state funded and locally funded projects.

The Reedley College Campus Committee is working with Darden Architects on its science facility expansion. The group had community meetings and is now in the design phase.

Darden is also working with the college on its new Fine & Performing Arts Center. The college is currently raising money for the Center which will have a \$ 5 million match from Measure C funds. Darden is working on a concept design and a video will be developed to assist in the fund raising efforts.



There are two Measure C projects on the Madera Community College Center campus. The Center for Advanced Manufacturing (CAM) expansion and the Madera Academic Village addition. The CAM design is expected to be completed in the fall and submitted to the state for approval in the spring of 2018. The District is reviewing the list of approved architects and will provide the Madera Campus Committee with three companies to interview in fall 2017. The committee will then make its selection and begin community input meetings.
