- 1) The group discussed exterior elevations first with the following comments noted:
 - a. Images with lots of glass and "wow" factor are preferred. Height helps. The transparency is open and inviting.
 - b. Image 15: group liked transparency to community
 - c. Image 31: the traditional building language of bottom, middle, and top was appreciated glass-modern look could be a nice play on Gaston middle school. Makes a great statement to students.
 - d. Image 41: same comments as 31. TCC connection.
 - e. Image 40 & 1: were disliked- not appropriate for State Center.
 - f. Image 46: looks like a prison; not enough windows.
 - g. Image 52: not enough glass, brick looks like a highschool, this is a college and should look like it. The two different forms do not speak to inclusion- seems like two different buildings even though its one.
 - h. Image 18: Overall pleasing modern appearance and nice outdoor porch. Need lots of outdoor sitting areas that are shaded.

- 3) Site Plan:
 - a. Academic Center- group coined term for gen ed /admin building.
 - b. CTE building is a little loud- noise will be blocked with landscaping
 - c. The benefit of facing the CTE garages east is that the building itself will provide shade in the afternoon and facilitate working on cars outside in the afternoon.
 - d. Option 2B is better for CTE trucks of off church street.
 - e. 10 acres to east will be commercial
 - f. Keep the two phase 1 buildings together don't separate with entry drive.
 - g. Bus route should connect to campus- this is one reason to align campus access to Fairview street to north.
 - h. Large parking areas are preferred (as shown) because they keep students together and offer better lighting.
 - i. Would like a traffic signal to cross street. Ask city for this.

Items Discussed Durring 5:30 to 7:00

- 1) Exterior Aesthetics
 - a. Image 3: Mix of contemporary with classical brick. Lots of glass creating a beacon to the community. Modern mixed with tradition brick links back to city college, and multi-story is good. On the negative side its style doesn't jive with existing Gaston Middle School- not modern enough.
 - b. Image 12: City College courtyard- group likes the secure yard for outdoor gathering and covered walkways.
 - c. Image 15: Like the scale, windows, brick, and how it glows at night.
 - d. Image 54: Like that its similar to nearby Edison High school, the campus needs to connect to other buildings in the area. Should be modern, warm and inviting. Looks like a LEED landscape- low maintenance. Overhangs are good.
 - e. Image 18: Like, very dynamic canopy shades entry and modern aesthetics connect to Edison High.
 - f. Image 17: Like the windows and the overhang draws you in. The industrial feel is a negative- it doesn't fit the context of the site.
 - g. Image 52-Dislike, not enough windows.
 - h. Image 22: Dislike, too boxy not inviting.
 - i. Image 1: Dislike the agricultural design vocabulary- this is not an AG college.

 - a. Group likes Modern/contemporary design
