What is OER?

- Open Educational Resources (OER) are materials for teaching or learning that are in the public domain or carry an open license that allows for the 5 Rs.
- OER materials are not defined by being free or digital
 - Not everything that is free is OER and not everything that is OER is free

Reuse: Content can be reused in its unaltered form

Retain: Users have the right to make, archive, and "own" copies of the content

Redistribute: Copies of the content can be shared with others in its original, revised or remixed form

Definition (ZTC)


All OER are ZTC, but not all ZTC are OER

Zero Textbook Cost is one that uses learning materials that cost the students zero dollars. This would be using current Library materials, some online educational materials (e.g., websites, videos, tutorials) that are free to the students. Or in some programs, the school provides that necessary textbook(s) as a student loan, so students do not have to pay out of pocket.



Definitions


- Zero Textbook Costs (ZTC): Course or program/degree/certificate that passes no cost on to the student for instructional materials
- Low Textbook Costs (LTC): Course that have instructional materials less than \$40.
- Open Educational Resources
 (OER): Textbook and other
 course materials that have an
 open license (e.g., public domain
 or creative commons) that allow for the 5
 Rs:
 - Reuse, Revise, Remix, Redistribute and Retain



Why OER?

There are many reasons to use OER. Here are just a few:

- Affordable students save money
- Flexible redistribute and reuse content
- Customizable revise and remix
 - Creativity: Create lessons that engage your students
- Up-to-date add the latest research, events, information
- Accessible can be more accessible than print copies
- Student Success: students are less likely to drop an OER course
- Beneficial to all knowledge can be freely and widely distributed around the world
- Immediately available online students do not have to wait to gain access to material


Have you avoided carrying a full unit load (≥ 12 u) in a semester because of textbook cost?






Were you able to afford ALL of your required textbooks...

Within the **first 3 wks** of class?




Within the first half of the semester?

New funding coming available: **Expansion Grant**


• CCCCO ZTC - OER Expansion

New funding coming available: **Impact Grant**

per eligible program, not per college) support high impact programs that benefit larger numbers of students at the institution that are likely duplicative and must leverage the efforts and materials from the ZTC Acceleration Grant's Coordination Cohorts upon validation of completion by the Open Educational Resources Initiative (OERI).
