

HOW TO READ THE SEP-A

The SEP-A is a Student Education Plan-Abbreviated. This is a 1 year plan to assist students select appropriate courses when registering during their 1st year at a community college. The plan is based on the discussion between a student and the counselor. During this conversation multiple measures are used to assess the best pathway for the student. Multiple measures may include but are not limited to: career/major choice, placement test, transcripts, personal information and preferences. The result of the conversation is a student education plan outlining the courses and load the student is planning per the advisement of the counselor.

The Prerequisite Chart provides a visual outline to students diagramming the sequence of English and math courses a student will need to initially complete.

Lists the students course placement.
Placement test results, transcripts, and other multiple measures may be used to determine initial course placement.

Identifies the career goal, related major, and academic goal the student selected based on personal choice and conversations with the counselor.

This lists the primary courses a student should register for on WebAdvisor to take during their first Fall semester. Prior to registration students should have already entered their proposed schedule by going into WebAdvisor searching and saving courses in their profile.

If students are unable to find the primary courses listed and/or are not able to create a schedule due to course times overlapping, students may select courses from the Alternate list to aid them in creating a schedule that will work for them.

Identifies key support services we recommend students access and utilize to increase the chance of success at college.
